#### RECOMMENDATION:



**WHEREAS**, the Engineering Report Setting Forth a Proposed 2<sup>nd</sup> Amendment to 1974 Plan for Water Allocation and Procedure for Setting State Water Tolls which was completed by the District's engineering consultant, AECOM, set forth a process and formula by which State Water Project water tolls should be calculated; and

WHEREAS, on April 21, 2009 after notice was given as required by law, a public hearing was held pursuant to California Constitution Article XIII D, Section 6(a) where written protests against the proposed increase to State Water Project water tolls were not presented by a majority of the owners/tenants of the affected parcels; and

**WHEREAS,** on April 21, 2009 the Board of Directors of this District adopted Resolution No. 2009-05, which sets forth the formula by which State Water Project water tolls should be calculated; and

**WHEREAS**, for calendar year 2021, the Board of Directors of this District has calculated the tolls for State Water Project water utilizing the formula set forth in Resolution No. 2009-05.

## DITCH ERADICATION AND COMMON USE AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is made this \_\_\_\_\_day of \_\_\_\_\_\_\_\_\_, 2021, by and between KERN DELTA WATER DISTRICT, a California water district ("District") and <u>JACARANDA HOOD, LLC.</u> ("Owner"). District and Owner are sometimes hereinafter individually or collectively called a "Party" or the "Parties".

#### WITNESSETH:

**WHEREAS**, District is the owner and operator of an irrigation canal commonly known as the **Branch One Canal** now existing as an open ditch and is the owner of an easement and right-of-way over and across certain real property in the City of Bakersfield, County of Kern, State of California, belonging to Owner and commonly referred to as Assessor Parcel No. <u>514-030-29</u>; and

**WHEREAS,** Owner desires to fill in and eradicate said open ditch and construct and install a Pipeline and appurtenances ("Facilities") as shown in Exhibit "A" to substitute the existing open ditch; and

**WHEREAS**, Owner desires to construct and maintain parking lot, patio, signage, landscape and other improvements to construct Owner's anticipated development ("Project") over and across District's easement for the Facilities ("Area of Common Use") as shown in Exhibit "B"; and

**WHEREAS,** District is willing to consent to the construction of the Project, installation of Facilities, and eradication of the existing ditch upon the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth.

NOW, THEREFORE, FOR GOOD AND VALUABLE CONSIDERATION, IT IS AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

#### 1. Construction of Facilities:

- a. Owner has prepared, at its expense, detailed plans, specifications (including bid and contract documents) for the excavation, construction of Facilities to be installed within the easement recorded as Document No. \_\_\_\_\_ ("District's Easement") which have been approved by the District. While not attached as an exhibit, the approved plans and specifications are incorporated herein and made a part hereof.
- b. Owner agrees to construct and install the Facilities in strict compliance with the plans and specifications prepared by Owner and approved in writing by District. In no event shall Owner install additional or different facilities without first obtaining the written approval of District.
- c. Owner agrees to construct and install the Facilities within District's Easement to the depth and on the grade as set forth in the approved plans and in the manner designated and approved in writing by District's engineer. In all instances, said construction and installation work shall be done at a time that will not interfere with the flow or distribution of water through the Canal as required and approved by District in writing unless otherwise approved by the District in writing. Owner acknowledges and agrees that work on said project can commence on **the assigned date approved by the District in writing.** Once the Canal is shut down, failure to complete the project by the assigned date, will result in liquidated damages of \$3,000.00 per day for every day the Canal is shut down or the project remains incomplete beyond the assigned date **unless District grants an extension to Owner in writing**. Owner agrees to furnish District a performance bond in the amount of **\$435,209.00** payable to District should Owner fail to complete the Facilities as approved by District or maintain the Facilities as required herein.
- d. Owner shall pay the entire cost of laying, constructing and installing the Facilities including the costs of all labor and materials incurred or used in connection with the installation, trenching, backfilling, leveling and testing of the same, and the cost of all engineering, professional and other necessary services furnished by District or others in connection therewith. In addition, District may hire at Owner's expense a construction inspector to inspect the work performed by Owner. Owner shall provide District copies of all as-built drawings depicting the location of the Project as constructed.
- e. In the event Owner does not pay the entire cost aforesaid and complete said work as provided in this Agreement, District may, but shall not be required to, pay such costs and complete such work, and Owner does hereby agree to repay District any amount so expended together with interest thereon at ten percent (10%) per annum from the date the same is expended until the date of repayment. In the event District is required to complete said work as provided in this Agreement, Owner acknowledges and agrees that Owner shall still be subject to and liable for the liquidated damages specified herein until District completes said work.
- f. Owner agrees that, upon completion of construction and installation of Facilities, and acceptance by District, the same shall become and remain the property of District, and Owner shall have no right, title, or interest therein. District shall be in sole and absolute control of the manner, method, and time of conducting and discharging water through Facilities.

g. Upon full performance of this Agreement by Owner, and the acceptance of said pipelines and other structures by District, District agrees to abandon the portion of its present open ditch and right of way which will be replaced by the Facilities. District will quitclaim to Owner all prior easements of record.

#### 2. <u>Maintenance and Warranty of Facilities</u>:

- a. Owner agrees to warrant, keep and maintain the Facilities in good condition and repair continuously for a period of three (3) years from and after the completion of construction and acceptance thereof by District and to pay all costs of such repairs and maintenance and of any replacement of any part thereof required to keep Facilities in good operating condition.
- b. Owner agrees that in the event it fails, neglects or refuses to repair, maintain or replace promptly, upon demand, any part of the Facilities, District shall have the right, but shall not be required, to make any such repairs or replacements and Owner does hereby agree to repay District the cost of any such repairs or replacements made by District, with interest at ten percent (10%) per annum from the date such cost is incurred to the date of repayment.
- c. Prior to commencement of construction, Owner agrees to make a one-time payment of 5% of the cost of said project to District for Districts assumption of future maintenance of the Facilities. It is understood that District's assumption of future maintenance of said pipelines will not begin until the expiration of Owners three (3) year warranty described in paragraph 2(a) above.

#### 3. <u>Construction of Project</u>

- a. District hereby consents to the construction, operation, maintenance and use of the Project in, on, along, across District's Easement in the Area of Common Use subject to the terms and conditions herein contained.
- b. Owner acknowledges District's Easement and the priority of such title over Owner's rights created by this Common Use Agreement. Except as expressly set forth herein, this Agreement shall not in any way alter, modify, or terminate the legal rights of District in its Easement or the Canal.
- c. District has and reserves the right to use, in common with Owner's use, the Area of Common Use for all of the purposes for which District's Easement was acquired, without need for any further permit or permission from Owner. Owner shall use the Area of Common Use in such a manner as to not unreasonably interfere with District's right to use District's Easement for any and all lawful purposes.
- d. Any construction work in the Area of Common Use shall be done at a time that will not interfere with the flow or distribution of water through the Canal as required and approved by District and not unreasonable interfere with the Project.

e. Owner shall pay the entire cost of constructing and installing the Project, including the costs of all labor and materials incurred or used in connection with the construction and installation of the Project.

#### 4. Maintenance of the Area of Common Use.

- a. Owner shall maintain the Project and other structures in the Area of Common Use, in good condition and repair and to pay all costs of such repairs and maintenance and of any replacement of any part thereof required to provide safe access to the Area of Common Use. Owner agrees to repair all damage to the Project and any other structures in the Area of Common caused by District's maintenance of the Canal within District's Easement.
- b. In the event Owner fails, neglects or refuses to repair, maintain or replace promptly, upon demand, any part of the Project or the structures connected therewith, District shall have the right, but shall not be required, to make any such repairs or replacements and Owner does hereby agree to repay District the cost of any such repairs or replacements made by District, with interest at 10% per annum from the date such cost is incurred to the date of repayment

#### 5. <u>Miscellaneous</u>:

- a. By entering into this agreement and shifting District's easement and means of conveyance into the Facilities, District does not extinguish, abandon, forfeit, relinquish, waive, modify, limit, restrict, or alter in any way District's water rights, including but not limited to, any and all water rights associated with or conveyed across the Owner's property, and this agreement further does not and will not restrict, interrupt, limit, or diminish District's use of and access to any of this water rights and water supplies.
- b. Owner hereby agrees and undertakes to indemnify, defend and hold harmless District, its officers, agents, and employees from any and all losses, costs, expenses (including reasonable attorneys' fees), claims, liabilities, actions or damages of any nature whatsoever, including injuries to or the death of any person or persons or damage to any property, in any way arising out of or connected with or incident to or alleged to have arisen in any manner out of, or to have been in any way connected with or incident to any willful act or omission of Owner, its officers, agents, employees, contractors, subcontractors, or independent contractors in the performance of this Agreement or to have occurred as a result of any willful acts or omissions by Owner, its officers, agents, and employees in the performance of this Agreement.
- c. Any contractor working in the Area of Common Use shall procure and maintain general liability insurance, providing coverage on an occurrence basis for bodily injury, including death, of one or more persons, property damage and personal injury, with limits of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) per occurrence. The liability policy shall contain an additional insured endorsement which shall expressly name the District, its officers, agents, servants, employees and consultants as additional insureds, without limitation. In addition, the contractor and/or subcontractors shall maintain workers' compensation insurance while working within the Area of Common Use. The workers' compensation policy shall contain an express

waiver of subrogation endorsement in favor of the District, its officers, agents, servants, employees and consultants. Said additional insured endorsement and workers' compensation subrogation endorsement shall be furnished in the form approved by the District's legal counsel prior to any work authorized pursuant to this Agreement.

- d. District and Owner shall not become or be deemed a partner or joint venturer or associate by reason of the provisions of this Agreement. Neither Party shall for any purpose be considered an agent, officer or employee of the other Party.
- e. The failure of any Party to enforce against another Party any provision of this Agreement shall not constitute a waiver of that Party's right to enforce such a provision at a later time and shall not serve to vary the terms of this Agreement.
- f. This Agreement may be modified only in writing approved by District and Owner and signed by all the Parties.
- g. In the event of a conflict between the terms, conditions or specifications set forth in this Agreement and those in exhibits attached hereto, the terms, conditions or specifications set forth in this Agreement shall prevail. All exhibits to which reference is made in this Agreement are deemed incorporated in this Agreement whether or not actually attached.
- h. All notices relative to this Agreement shall be given in writing and shall be personally served or sent by certified or registered mail and be effective upon actual personal service or depositing in the United States mail. The Parties shall be addressed as follows, or at any other address designated by notice:

- i. The laws of the State of California will govern the validity of this Agreement, its interpretation and performance. Any litigation arising in any way from this Agreement shall be brought in Kern County, California.
- j. Neither this Agreement, nor any interest in it, may be assigned or transferred by any Party without the prior written consent of all the Parties. Any such assignment may be subject to additional terms and conditions not set forth herein.

- k. The rights and obligations of this Agreement shall inure to the benefit of, and be binding upon, the Parties to this Agreement and their heirs, administrators, executors, personal representatives, successors and assigns.
- l. Each individual signing this Agreement on behalf of the respective entities represents and warrants that he or she is, respectively, duly authorized to sign on behalf of the entities and to bind the entities fully to each and all of the obligations set forth in this Agreement.
- m. Each Party shall execute and deliver such papers, documents, and instruments, and perform such acts as are necessary or appropriate, to implement the terms of this Agreement and the intent of the Parties to this Agreement.
- n. The losing party agrees to pay the prevailing party reasonable attorney's fees, trial preparation expense, and court costs in any action brought to enforce any of the terms, covenants or conditions of this Agreement.
- o. The maintenance obligations assumed by Owner pursuant to this Agreement is hereby declared to constitute a covenant running with the servient tenement.
- p. District and Owner agree that neither will hold District's engineer responsible for alleged engineering defects in the above-described project facilities unless such claim results from such engineer's failure as District's consultant to exercise the judgment and care, under circumstances then prevailing, which duly licensed civil engineers of prudence, skill, discretion and intelligence would exercise in (1) the review and approval of the plans and specifications for the design and construction of the subject facilities or (2) any review or supervision of construction necessary to protect the District's interests in insuring the adequacy and integrity of the new facilities.












## Cross Valley Canal Deliveries by Direction and Source 2021





AB 377 (Rivas, Robert D) Water quality: impaired waters.

**Summary:** Would require all California surface waters to be fishable, swimmable, and drinkable by January 1, 2050, as prescribed. The bill would prohibit the state board and regional boards from authorizing an NPDES discharge, waste discharge requirement, or waiver of a waste discharge requirement that causes or contributes to an exceedance of a water quality standard, or from authorizing a best management practice permit term to authorize a discharge that causes or contributes to an exceedance of a water quality standard in receiving waters. The bill would prohibit, on or after January 1, 2030, a regional water quality control plan from including a schedule for implementation for achieving a water quality standard that was adopted as of January 1, 2021, and would prohibit a regional water quality control plan from including a schedule for implementation of a water quality standard that is adopted after January 1, 2021, unless specified conditions are met. **Laws:** An act to add Chapter 3.5 (commencing with Section 13150) to Chapter 3 of Division 7 of the Water Code, relating to water quality.

Notes: This legislation would require all waters of the state to be fishable, swimmable, and drinkable by 2050. This is contrary to federal and state law regarding the designation of water bodies for beneficial uses. The legislation provides that a basin water quality control plan can only include a schedule for implementation of a water quality standard that is adopted after January 1, 2021, if certain conditions are met. This provision would, in effect, end the recent CV-Salts program that is the product of a collaborative stakeholder driven and managed program to develop sustainable salinity and nitrate management planning for the Central Valley. The Central Valley Salinity Alternatives for Long-Term Sustainability initiative (CV-SALTS) began in 2006 as a coalition of representatives from agriculture, municipalities, industry, water supply, environmental justice, state and federal regulatory agencies and the public to develop an environmentally and economically sustainable plan for the management of salt and nitrate in the Central Valley. A Salt and Nutrient Management Plan is addressing legacy and ongoing loadings of salt and nitrate in the Central Valley, and presents a comprehensive regulatory and programmatic approach for the sustainable management of salt and nitrate in groundwater and surface water. The Plan Antidegradation Analysis notes: "U.S. EPA regulations also require state water quality standard submittals to include an antidegradation policy to protect beneficial uses and prevent further degradation of high quality waters (33 U.S.C. § 1313(d) (4)(B); 40 C.F.R. § 131.12). In general, the Federal Antidegradation Policy emphasizes the maintenance of existing ambient conditions. The Federal Antidegradation Policy considers lowering of water quality to be allowable in some cases, including those where the costs of control would cause widespread and substantial economic and social impacts." The State's Antidegradation Policy is embodied in SWRCB Resolution No. 68-16 (Statement of Policy with Respect to Maintaining High Quality Waters in California). In general, the policy emphasizes the protection of high quality waters, which include groundwater.

According to the Central Valley Salinity Coalition: "Many activities are underway to achieve compliance with the new Nitrate Control Program in the Central Valley's six Priority 1 subbasins, where safe drinking water must be provided in areas with high nitrate levels and nitrate management plans must be adopted beginning in 2021. These subbasins include Modesto, Turlock, Chowchilla, Kings, Kaweah, and Tule. Early steps on the path toward compliance have included outreach to permittees and disadvantaged community leaders, data collection, cost assessments, provision of drinking water, and progress toward the complex task of Management Zone formation."

Similarly, this legislation would negatively affect the Irrigated Lands Regulatory Program, which was initiated in 2003 to prevent agricultural runoff from impairing surface waters. Groundwater regulations were added to the program in 2012. Waste discharge requirements designed to protect both surface water and groundwater address irrigated agricultural discharges throughout the Central Valley.

**Summary:** Would establish the Biodiversity Protection and Restoration Act and would provide that it is the policy of the state that all state agencies, boards, and commissions shall utilize their authorities in furtherance of the biodiversity conservation purposes and goals of certain executive orders. The bill would require all state agencies, boards, and commissions to consider and prioritize the protection of biodiversity in carrying out their statutory mandates. The bill would require strategies related to the goal of the state to conserve at least 30% of California's land and coastal waters by 2030 to be made available to the public and provided to certain legislative committees by no later than June 30, 2022. **Laws:** An act to add Chapter 14 (commencing with Section 2950) to Division 3 of Fish and Game Code, relating to biodiversity.

**Notes:** This legislation would establish two state policies: First, that all state agencies, boards, and commissions must utilize their authorities in furtherance of the biodiversity conservation purposes and goals of Executive Orders B-54-18 and N-82-20; and, all state agencies, boards, and commissions must consider and prioritize the protection of biodiversity in carrying out their statutory mandate. Second, that public agencies are prohibited from approving projects as proposed that are inconsistent with or would impair the successful implementation of strategies that will not be recommended to Governor Newsom until next year.

The legislation is premature at best. Like the Human Right to Water state policy, this legislation will influence every state action in the resources arena. The legislation is unclear in many aspects. For example, does the requirement to prioritize the protection of biodiversity become the top priority? Or one of many priorities? Local agencies are "public agencies." Project approvals by local agencies run the gamut from housing to transportation to water. The terms "inconsistent" and "impair" are not defined.

**Summary:** The Sustainable Groundwater Management Act requires all groundwater basins designated as high- or medium-priority basins by the Department of Water Resources that are designated as basins subject to critical conditions of overdraft to be managed under a groundwater sustainability plan or coordinated groundwater sustainability plans by January 31, 2020, and requires all other groundwater basins designated as high- or medium-priority basins to be managed under a groundwater sustainability plan or coordinated groundwater sustainability plans by January 31, 2022, except as specified. This bill would state the intent of the Legislature to enact statutory changes relating to the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act.

Laws: An act relating to groundwater.

**Notes:** This legislation is a placeholder that will require substantive amendments before it can be referred to an Assembly policy committee. The Coalition should monitor the legislation given the subject matter--Sustainable Groundwater Management Act.

#### **AB 1021** (Mayes I) Irrigation districts: divisions.

**Summary:** Current law, the Irrigation District Law, provides for the formation of irrigation districts with prescribed powers. The law authorizes an irrigation district to control, distribute, store, spread, sink, treat, purify, recapture, and salvage any water, as specified. Current law provides that each district

shall contain 5 divisions unless otherwise specified. This bill would make a nonsubstantive change to the law providing for those 5 divisions.

Laws: An act to amend Section 21550 of the Water Code, relating to irrigation districts.

**Notes:** This legislation is a placeholder that will require substantive amendments before it can be referred to an Assembly policy committee. The Coalition should monitor the legislation given the subject matter--irrigation districts.

#### AB 1164 (Flora R) Dams and reservoirs: exclusions.

**Summary:** Current law requires the Department of Water Resources to supervise the maintenance and operation of dams and reservoirs as necessary to safeguard life and property. Current law requires the department to adopt, by regulation, a schedule of fees to cover the department's costs in carrying out the supervision of dam safety. Current law excludes certain obstructions from being considered a dam, including a barrier that is not across a stream channel, watercourse, or natural drainage area and that has the principal purpose of impounding water for agricultural use. This bill would specify that the exclusion from being considered a dam for a barrier that is not across a stream channel, watercourse, or natural drainage area and that has the principal purpose of impounding water for agricultural use applies only to a barrier owned or operated by a private entity. The bill would provide that a barrier owned or operated by a public entity that is not across a stream channel, watercourse, or natural drainage area and that has the principal purpose of impounding water for agricultural use shall not be considered a dam only if certain criteria are met.

Laws: An act to amend Section 6004 of the Water Code, relating to water.

**Notes:** This legislation is similar to AB 727 (2019) by the same author. The Coalition supported that bill, which was held in Senate Natural Resources & Water Committee. Existing law excludes certain obstructions from being considered a dam, including a barrier not across a stream channel, watercourse, or natural drainage area and that has the principal purpose of impounding water for agricultural use. This legislation would specify that a structure owned or operated by a public entity may have the principal purpose of impounding water for agricultural use for the purposes of an exclusion from being a considered a dam.

Farm water districts often rely on diversion structures across a watercourse to deliver water supplies for agricultural purposes. DWR has interpreted the above provision of law to only apply to a private entity. VAWC disagrees with this interpretation and believes the proper focus should be on the purpose of the barrier and not the owner.

**Summary:** The Porter-Cologne Water Quality Control Act authorizes the State Water Resources Control Board to certify or provide a statement to a federal agency, as required pursuant to federal law, that there is reasonable assurance that an activity of any person subject to the jurisdiction of the state board will not reduce water quality below applicable standards. The federal act provides that if a state fails or refuses to act on a request for this certification within a reasonable period of time, which shall not exceed one year after receipt of the request, then the state certification requirements are waived with respect to the federal application. This bill would require the state board to make the certificate or statement available on its internet website for a 60-day public comment and review period, and would provide that the certificate or statement shall not be final until voted upon by a majority of the members of the state board at the conclusion of that period.

Laws: An act to amend Section 13160 of the Water Code, relating to water quality.

**Notes:** This legislation could add to the amount of time that the State Water Board dedicates to review and approval of a water quality certification (e.g., a Section 401 certification). While the specified review periods may improve transparency and public access to the process, the 60-day period could lead to increased issuances of the certificate or statement before completion of the environmental review.

**Notes:** This legislation is a placeholder that will require substantive amendments before it can be referred to an Assembly policy committee. The Coalition should monitor the legislation given the subject matter--diversion of water and penalties related thereto.

Laws: An act relating to climate change.

**Summary:** Would establish the Canal Conveyance Capacity Restoration Fund in the State Treasury to be administered by the Department of Water Resources. The bill would require all moneys deposited in

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the fund to be expended, upon appropriation by the Legislature, in support of subsidence repair costs, including environmental planning, permitting, design, and construction and necessary road and bridge upgrades required to accommodate capacity improvements. The bill would require the department to expend from the fund, upon appropriation by the Legislature, specified monetary amounts to restore the capacity of 4 specified water conveyance systems, as prescribed, with 2 of those 4 expenditures being in the form of a grant to the Friant Water Authority and to the San Luis and Delta-Mendota Water Authority. The bill would make these provisions inoperative on July 1, 2030, and would repeal the provisions as of January 1, 2031.

Laws: An act to add and repeal Section 140.5 of the Water Code, relating to water.

**Notes:** This legislation would authorize the State of California to cost-share in projects to address subsidence damage to four conveyance facilities in the San Joaquin Valley--California Aqueduct, Delta-Mendota Canal, Friant-Kern Canal, and the joint use facilities at San Luis Reservoir. It is anticipated that supporters of the legislation will seek Federal and local cost-share authorizations in equal amounts. This legislation does not contain an appropriation. A combination of State General Fund and State General Obligation Bond proceeds is likely to be considered. SB 45, the Senate Democratic leadership resources bond proposal, as introduced, includes a \$50 million allocation for Friant-Kern Canal.
