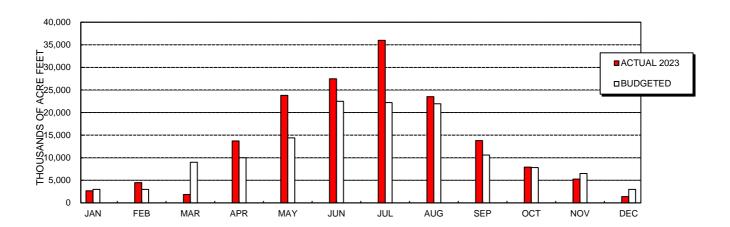

RECOMMENDATION:

Receive report, informational only.

DISCUSSION:

The Investment Policy of Kern Delta Water District requires the District's Treasurer to submit to the Board of Directors a quarterly investment report. In compliance with this directive the District Controller offers the following discussion and analysis of the District's cash and cash equivalents position and performance through the fourth and final quarter of the year ended December 31, 2023.

A comparative overview of the District's cash and cash equivalents position as of December 31, 2023, is shown in the following table:

LPL Financial Review:

\$3,000,000 in US Treasuries matured early in the fourth Quarter and paid interest in the amount of \$121,590 at an annualized yield of 4.33% as expected. In October the District purchased \$3,000,000 in US Treasuries that will earn 5.05% annualized until they mature in October 2025.

The District booked accrued interest income in the amount of \$536,000 on all US Treasuries in inventory that were held throughout 2023 with maturities in 2024 and 2025. An additional \$118,000 in accrued interest earned by the Fixed Income CDs investment throughout 2023 was booked at year end. These CDs also have maturity dates in 2024 and 2025.

JP Morgan Funds Review:

The Funds held at JP Morgan are in money market accounts that are 100% invested in US Treasuries. At the end of 2023 the average daily yield on these funds was 4.98%, down slightly from the previous quarter yield of 5.1%. The District continues to monitor the performance of these funds against the yields provided by the Kern County Treasury. Interest earned on these funds totaled \$94,768 for the fourth quarter. Excess cash made available in the normal course of operations is directed to the JP Morgan account as soon as possible where they earn interest at the rates noted until management is directed by the Business and Finance Committee to move them elsewhere.

Kern County Treasury Funds: Yields on cash reserves held at the Kern County Treasury (KCT) have improved but are still outpaced by the yields provided by the District's investments held in money market and long-term instruments. As of September 30, 2023, the annualized yield on KCT funds was 2.91% compared to 2.65% as of June 30, 2023. At the direction of the Board of Directors, staff continues to steer cash reserves away from KCT and into the higher yield money market and long-term holdings noted.

The attached "Kern Delta Water District Summary of Invested Cash Reserves" and "Kern County Treasurer's Pooled Cash Portfolio Summary" describe the nature and mix of the investments held at LPL Financial and at the KCT, respectively, as of November 30, 2023.

As of November 30, 2023, the Fair Market Value of KCT funds had increased slightly to 97.7% of Cost compared to 97.2% on August 31, 2023. The FMV of U.S. Treasuries and Federal Agencies, representing 85.3% of the entire KCT portfolio, is 97.7% and is, obviously, a key factor in the overall valuation of the portfolio. As a reminder, the FMV adjustment is a valuation disclosure required by generally accepted accounting principles and does not reflect the purchasing power of the investment. If all invested cash was liquidated from the District's accounts at Kern County, the actual cost, plus accrued interest, would be recovered and not the fair market value.

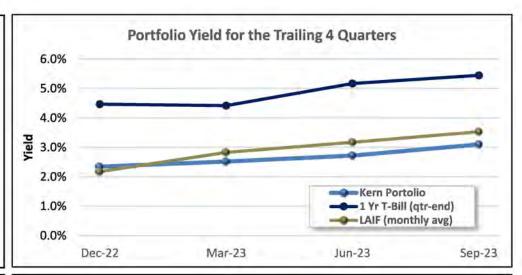

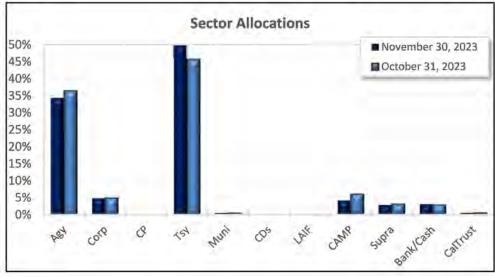

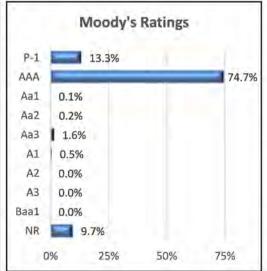

Maintenance Report

December 2023

 - e. Secured 15 Ditch head gate using all thread and mortar.
 - f. Replaced stem on Central gates 265 and 253b.
 - g. Replaced rails and stem on the 20-foot gate 135.
 - h. Inspected BV gates and weirs while waiting for Kern Island and Central to drain down.
 - i. Dredge the Kern Island form 4th Street to P Street and the Central from the split to Hwy 58 using long reach excavator. Reshaped banks and placed spoils onsite.
 - j. Used the long reach to dredge the Kern Island upstream of weir 631A; the 20-Foot from weir 532 around the bend on north bank; and the head of the Drain by the road crossing.

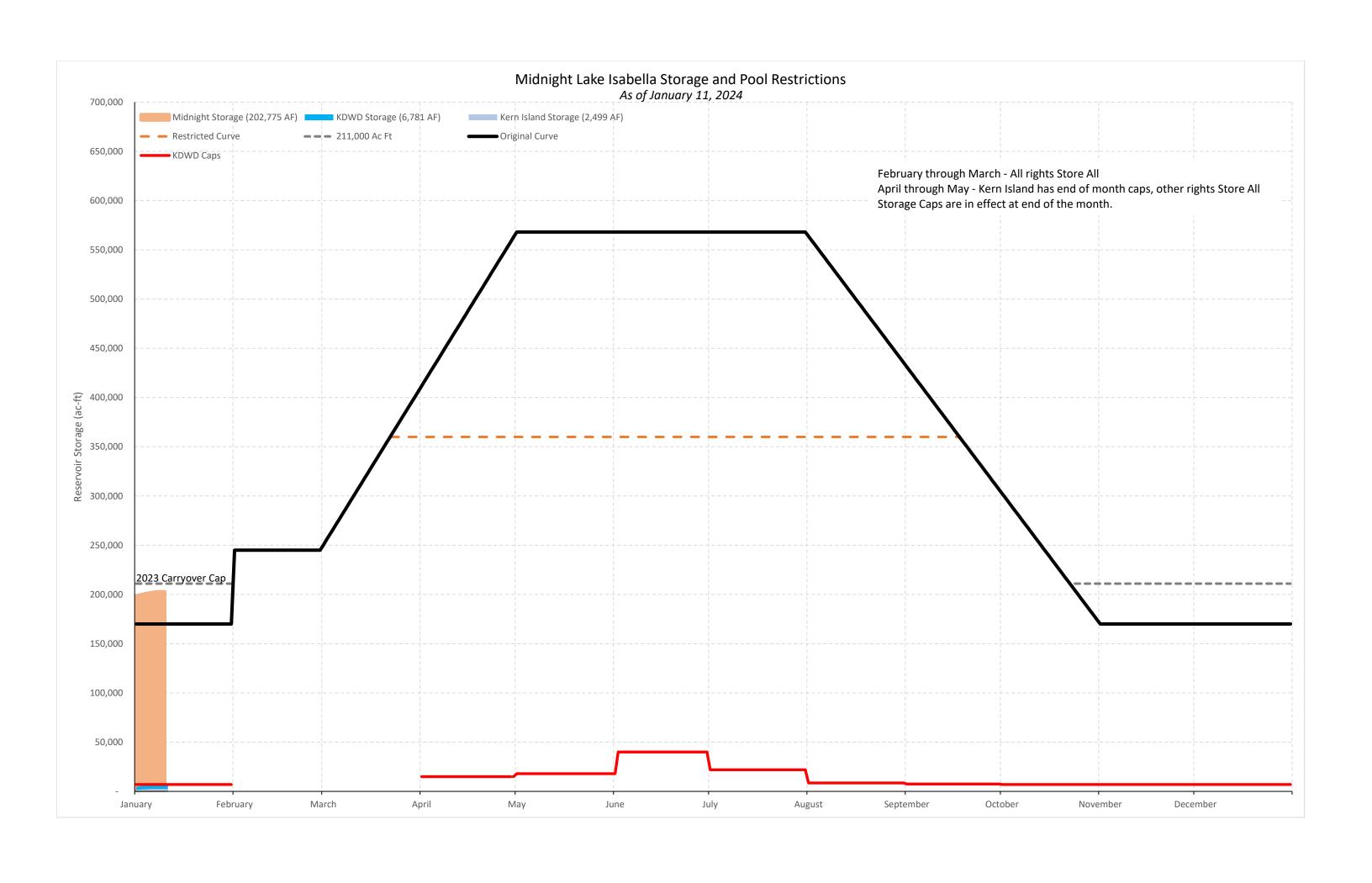

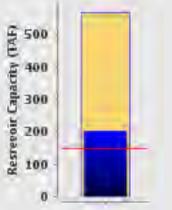


CURRENT RESERVOIR CONDITIONS



Isabella Lake Conditions

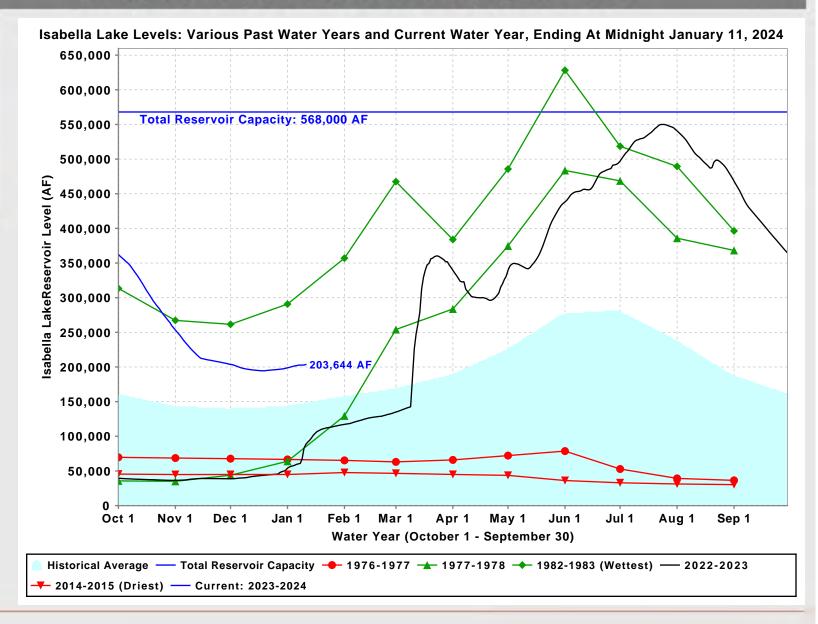

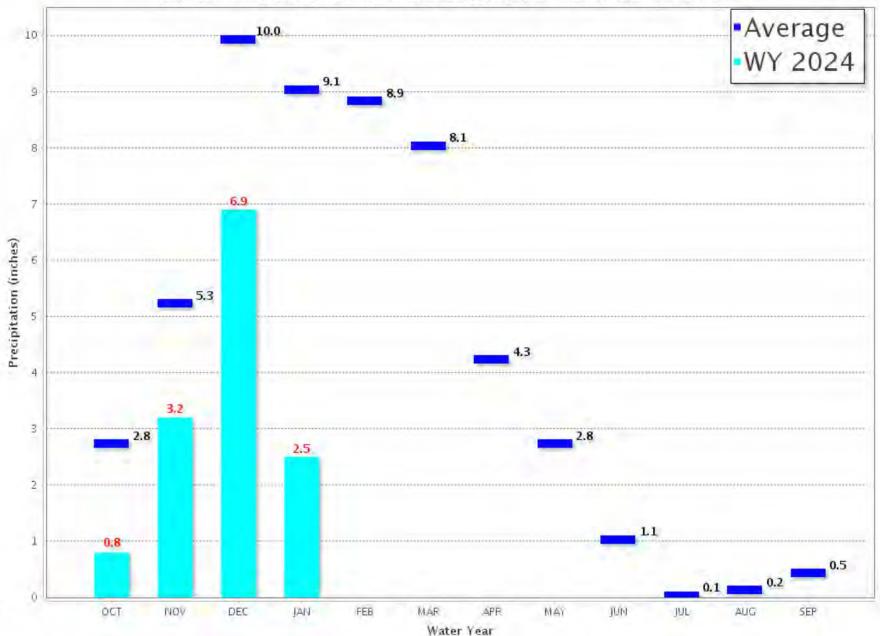




Northern Sierra 8-Station

Water Year (October 1 - September 30)

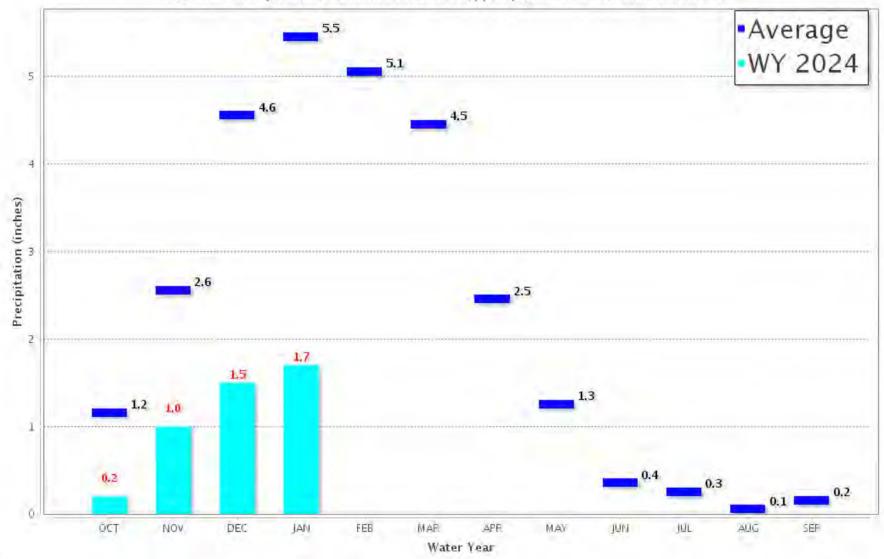


Tulare Basin 6-Station

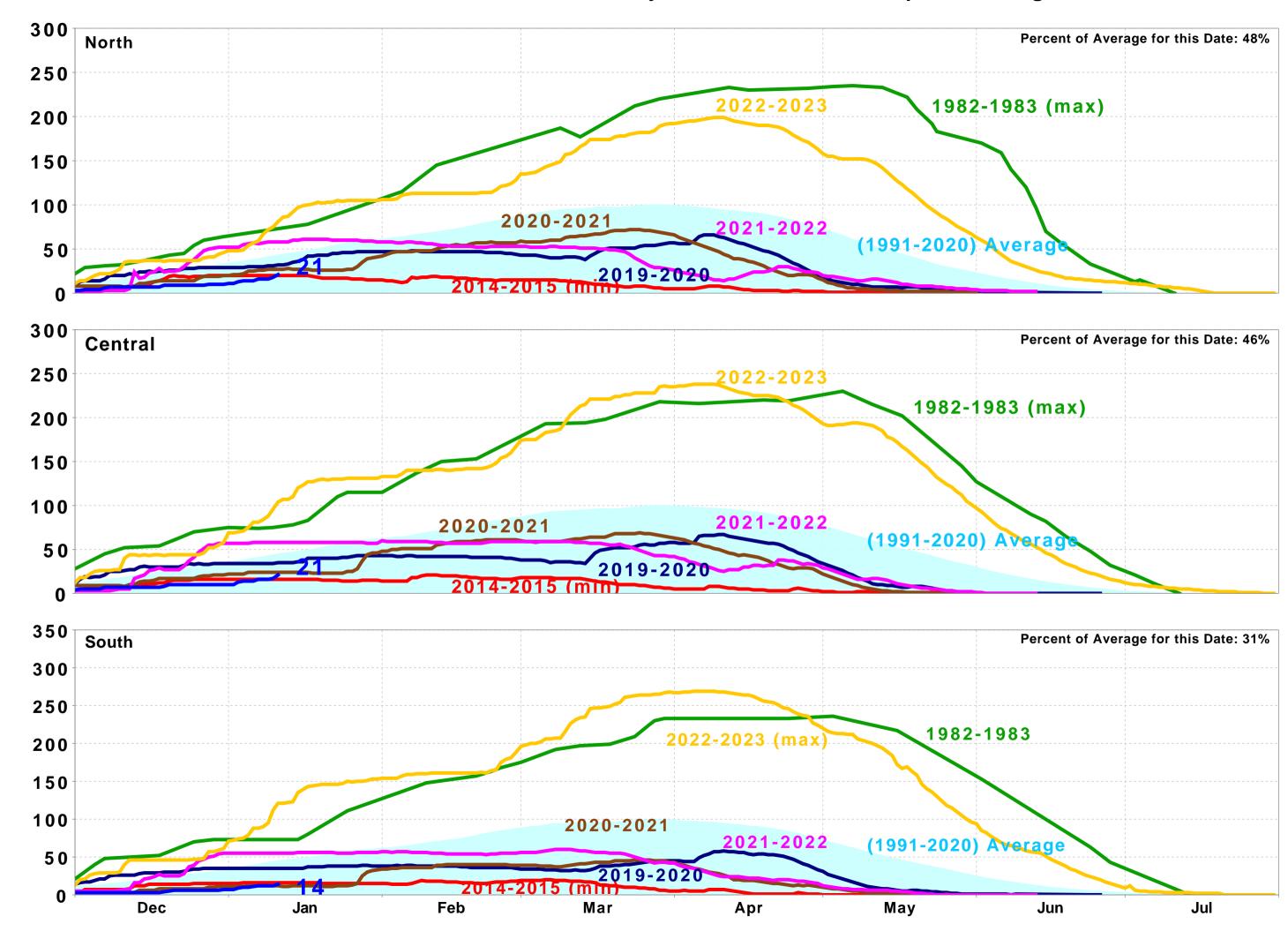

Water year 2023 provided much-needed relief following three of the most severely dry years on record. However, water year 2024 is off to a slow start with precipitation amounts at about half of average in October and November. To make the initial 2024 allocation, the Department of Water Resources (DWR) forecasts what water supplies will be available if the current dry pattern continues through the remainder of the water year 2024. As a result, DWR is initially allocating 10 percent of most State Water Project (SWP) contractors' requested Table A amounts for 2024, as shown in Attachment A – 2024 SWP Allocation. The dry start to this year is a reminder that we must continue to prepare for swings between wet and dry conditions.

To determine the available SWP water supplies, DWR considers factors including SWP contractors' anticipated 2023 carryover supplies into 2024, projected 2024 demands, existing storage in SWP conservation facilities, estimates of future runoff, SWP operational and regulatory requirements from the Federal Endangered Species Act and California Endangered Species Act, and water rights obligations under the State Water Resources Control Board's authority. DWR may revise the SWP allocation if hydrologic conditions change.

DWR will develop the 10-percent water delivery schedules by prorating the 15-percent schedules submitted by the Contractors in October 2023 (as part of initial requests) with any subsequent updates. If a contractor foresees any changes to their water delivery schedule, please communicate such changes to DWR in a timely manner.

- January 8th snow sensor data measuring snow water equivalent (SWE) is shown in Attachment 1. The SWE as a percentage of the April 1st measurement ranges from 6% to 33%.
- The Tulare Basin Precipitation: 6-Station Index for January 8th indicates 38% of average for this date as shown in attachment 2. Last months Watermaster report included the same plot for December 11th which showed 22% of average for that date.
- The California Nevada River Forecast Center on July 8th is forecasting the April through July snow melt season to be 67% of average as shown in Attachment 3.
- The NOAA Climate Prediction Center 8-14 day Outlook is showing both temperatures and precipitation to be leaning above normal as shown in Attachment 4.

Cloud Seeding - Since the December 11th Watermaster Report, flights occurred on 12/30 for 2.4 hours, 1/03 for 1.5 hours, and 1/06 for 1.4 hours.

Isabella Reservoir Operations - Attachment 5 shows the trend in storage for the water year from October 1 to January 7th. Storage for January 7th was 202,642 acre-feet. Attachment 6 shows the daily storage at midnight, the mean daily outflow and mean mean daily inflow from December 1, 2023 to January 7, 2024.

Isabella Partners started repairs at the hydroelectric plant located at the base of the dam on December 31, 2023 and completed the work on January 7, 2024 working 24 hours per day. Repairs were required to steel and concrete structural components damaged during the high flows in WY 2023. Normal operations resumed in the afternoon on January 7th.

Aerial Snow Observatory - Three flights are planned for the Kern in WY 2024. The first flight for the Kern under DWR's Aerial Remote Sensing of Snow (ARSS) program is planned for the 3rd or 4th week in February. The second flight is tentatively planned for the end of March and the third flight is planned for the end of April or early May if there is significant snow accumulation.

Public Outreach - I responded to public inquiries regarding reservoir operations.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The North West Kern Resource Conservation District (RCD) has pursued the goals of the District's Long-Range Work Plan throughout the course of the year, emphasizing Irrigation Water Management (IWM). The boundaries of the RCD encompass a total of 744,800 acres, reaching as far west as the north western portion of Kern County, then along the county line east of Delano, and then almost as far south as Taft, with areas in between that are not included in the boundaries.

NEW EMPLOYEE

After 36 years of service to the RCD, Brian will be retiring at the end of March 2024. To fill that void, Beth Hilbe was hired in June as the new Assistant Manager with the intent of taking the reins once Brian has left the building. Beth has an environmental background and is a good fit for the position as she will be dealing not only with field work doing irrigation evaluations, but also government agencies on the federal, state, and local level. This she has been doing and is transitioning well into the position.

ACKNOWLEDGMENT

The Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) aided the RCD through in-kind services, of which involved the usage of office space, information, materials within the office and office personnel.

MEETINGS

- Contribution Agreement No. NR239104XXXXC001 (\$52,500.00 for three years) dated October 1, 2022, through September 30, 2025.
- The district has an agreement with the Almond Board of California for \$30,000.00 to work with almond growers in the San Joaquin Valley.
- 3. DWR grant through Cal Poly San Luis Obispo as a subcontractor. Subcontract No. 2024-10-48604. (\$322,500.00) dated August 15, 2023, through July 14, 2024.

POSO CREEK

The RCD continues to work with FEMA to restore the levees that were destroyed out near the Kern National Wildlife Refuge when flooding occurred in 2017 (Yes, that was a long time ago). The creek flooded again this year in March which has increased the number of repairs needed on the levees. The RCD continues to work with FEMA, California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) and Army Corp. of Engineers to repair the damages to the levees. Due to the weather, the creek bed was not dry enough to perform the repairs this summer.

FUNDING

The Mobile Lab is funded through a fee for service. Support from local water districts keeps this fee affordable. In addition, funding is received from the Natural Resources Conservation Service, as mentioned above under 'Agreements,' along with monies from the Almond Board of California.

A total of 157 evaluations were conducted on 18,489 acres during the 2023 irrigation season, with 17 of these being conducted under the NRCS/EQIP Water Conservation program.

OBSERVATIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Micro-Irrigation Systems

The main cause of non-uniformity during the irrigation season was due to a variation in system pressures. These variations were typically due to improperly set control valves, plugged hose screens and/or debris that had accumulated in the sub-mains and manifolds causing a reduction in pressure. By resetting valves and cleaning hose screens, most of the problems that occurred in these systems were corrected. With the removal of these problems, overall system uniformity improved dramatically, as shown through later tests.

Other observations and recommendations made during the season included:

- Installation or replacement of flow meter The flow meter is an indispensable management tool that can help to monitor the amount of water applied throughout the season. Also, checking the flow meter frequently can help to detect system problems. For example, a steady decline in flow rate may indicate pump wear or a drop in the water level of a well. A slight decline in flow rate can indicate emitter plugging as well.
- Opening Flush-outs Upon opening some of the manifold flush outs, it was
 discovered that the water was very dirty in some systems. Manifold flush-outs should
 be opened periodically to flush out silt and debris that was not removed by the filters.
 The frequency at which this should occur will depend on the quality of the irrigation
 water and the effectiveness of the filters.
- 3. Hose Flushing Most water users were very good about flushing hose ends, but in some cases the water coming out the end of the hose was very dirty. With micro-irrigation systems, it is very important to periodically undo the ends of each individual line and flush the dirt and debris from it. If this is not done on a regular basis, the dirty water in the hoses can plug the emitters. Hoses should be flushed as often as necessary depending on the quality of the irrigation water.
- 4. Emitter Plugging This was found to be a problem at numerous locations. With micro-irrigation systems, bacteria and algae can build up inside the hoses and emitters and may eventually cause plugging. This can be avoided by regularly injecting chlorine or acid into the system, or some type of material that will promote the breakdown of these clogging agents. Emitters can also be replaced where needed.
- 5. Hose Screens Hose screens are valuable for removing large particles that may have escaped from the filter system. However, they can become plugged with algae or debris, thus reducing pressure to a given hose line, and thereby decreasing uniformity to the overall irrigation system. This was found to be the case in some situations throughout the irrigation season, but not as much as in the past as operators are taking out or not even including them in the installation of the system. Chlorine/acid injection can help to prevent this problem from occurring, however, hose screens should be checked periodically for clogging. If they are clogged, they can be rinsed clean or replaced. Not all systems have hose screens installed to avoid this potential plugging problem. Even in some of the older systems, the screens had been taken out.
- 6. <u>Leaks</u> It is important that irrigation workers are aware of leaks due to damaged hoses, missing emitters, broken valves, leaky risers, etc. Even a small leak can reduce the pressure in a line and cause a non-uniform application of water. On several occasions, leaks were a contributing factor in the overall non-uniformity of the system. If the leaks are big enough, they can cause substantial water loss.
- 7. <u>Different Emitter Types</u> Mixing emitters can adversely affect the distribution uniformity by applying different amounts of water to those plants with different

emitter sizes. Emitters are often mixed accidentally by irrigation workers when they come across a broken or plugged emitter in the field. When repairing these emitters,

they may sometimes substitute a different emitter type because it is the only one available at the time. It is essential in this situation to match the replacement emitter with the existing ones in the field to maintain the proper flow and uniformity of the irrigation system. Most of the time, there may be one additional type of emitter due to the above-mentioned situation. On various occasions however, there were several different emitter types in the field, lending to severe non-uniformity.

Preparing for the 2024 irrigation season

As growers are getting ready for the upcoming season, the Mobile Lab will be available to assist them with their irrigation needs. Being an efficient irrigation water manager is essential in today's water environment, as we are faced with many water related challenges that will impact the way we do business in the future.

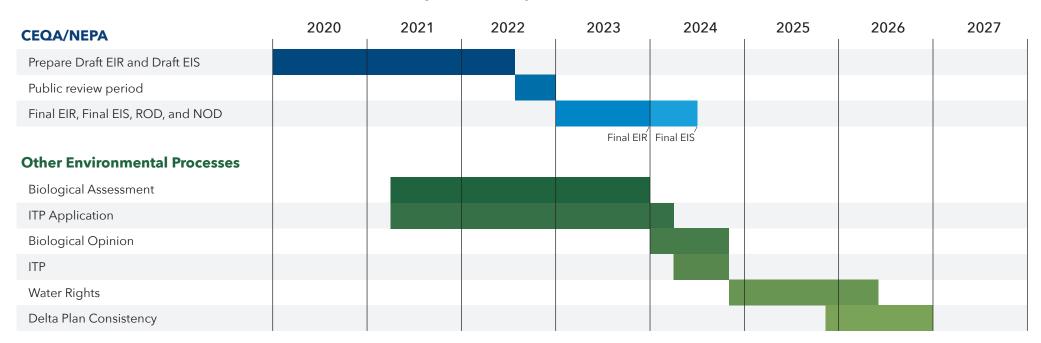

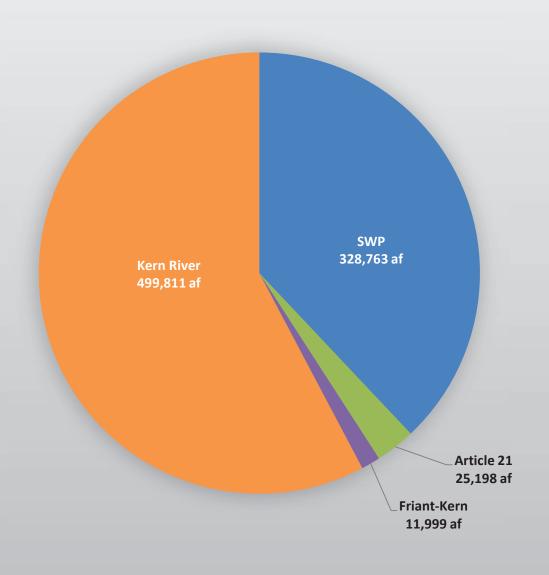

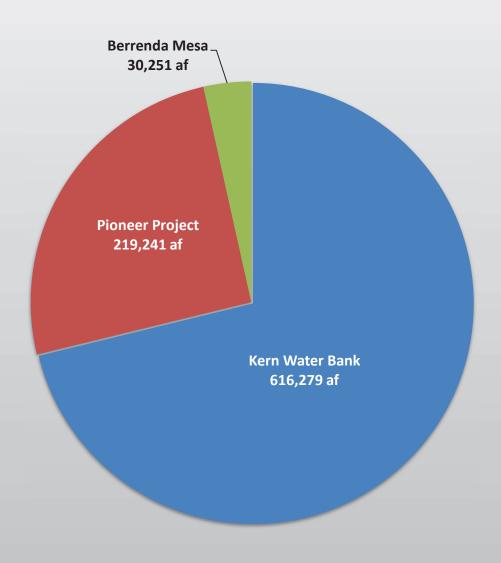

2023 Estimated Kern Fan Banking Project Deliveries (by Water Type) Deliveries through November 30, 2023 Total Deliveries 865,771 af

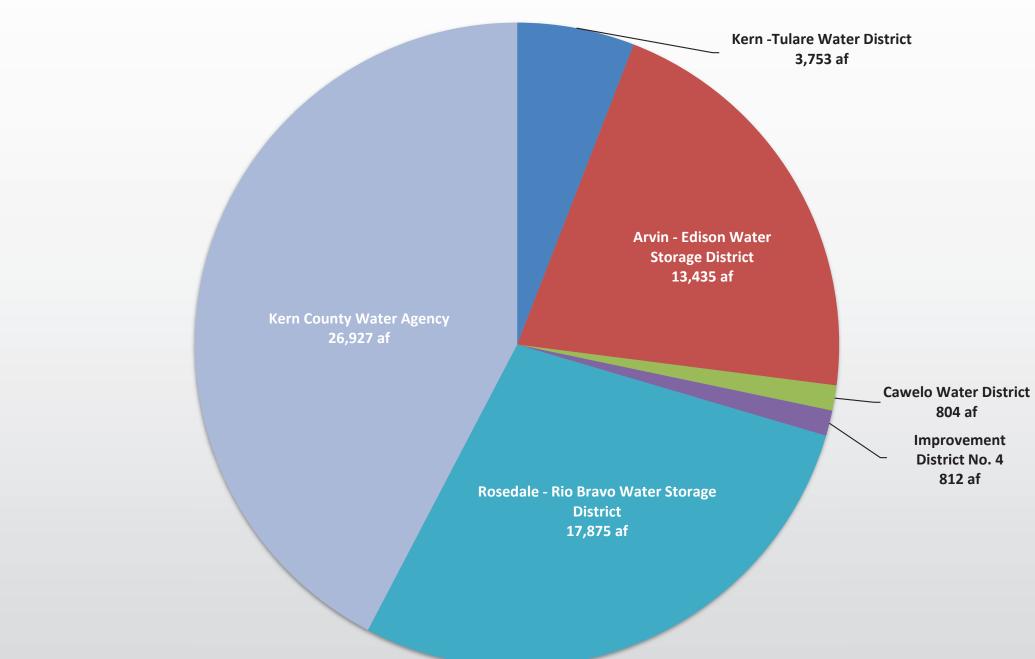


2023 Estimated Kern Fan Banking Project Deliveries (by Project)

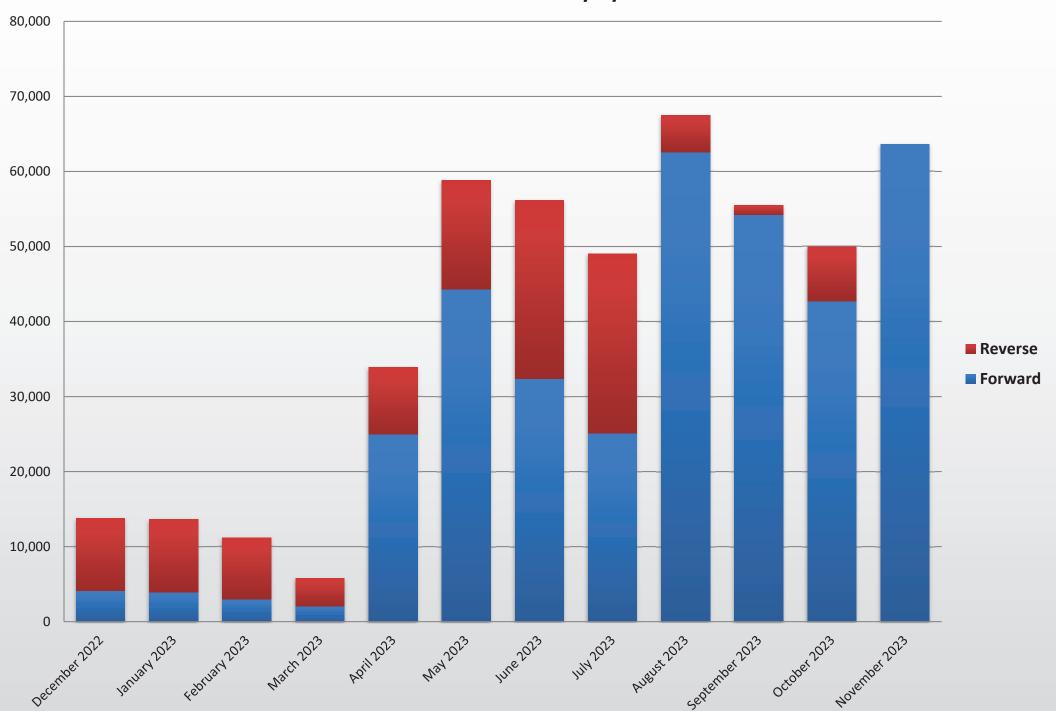

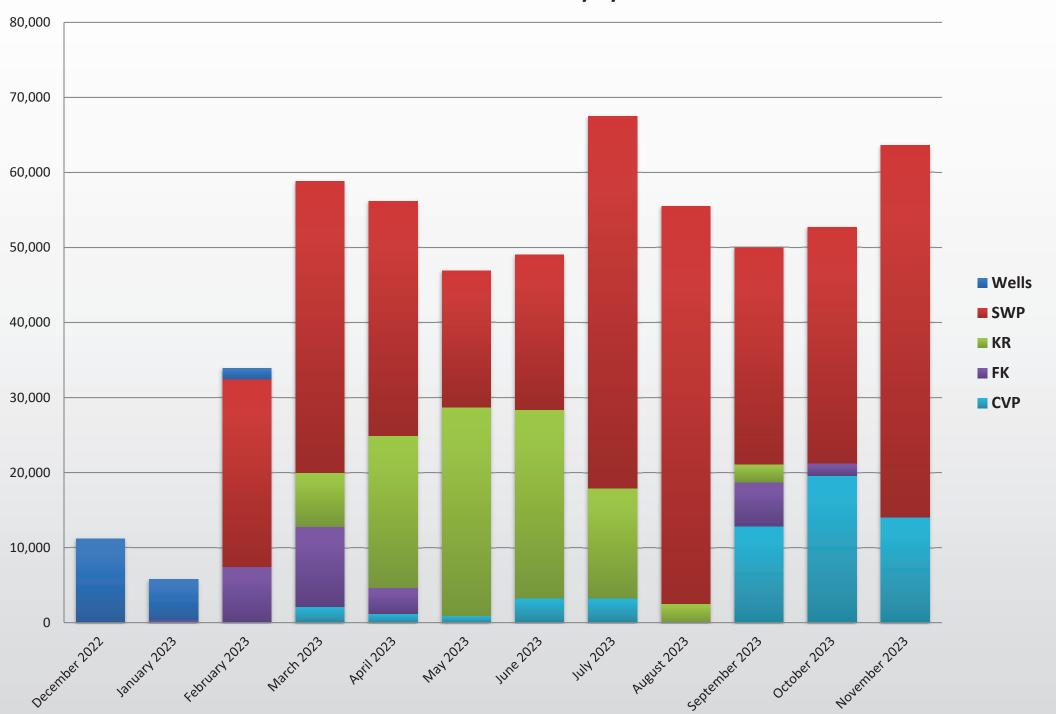
Cross Valley Canal November 2023 Deliveries Total deliveries 63,606 af

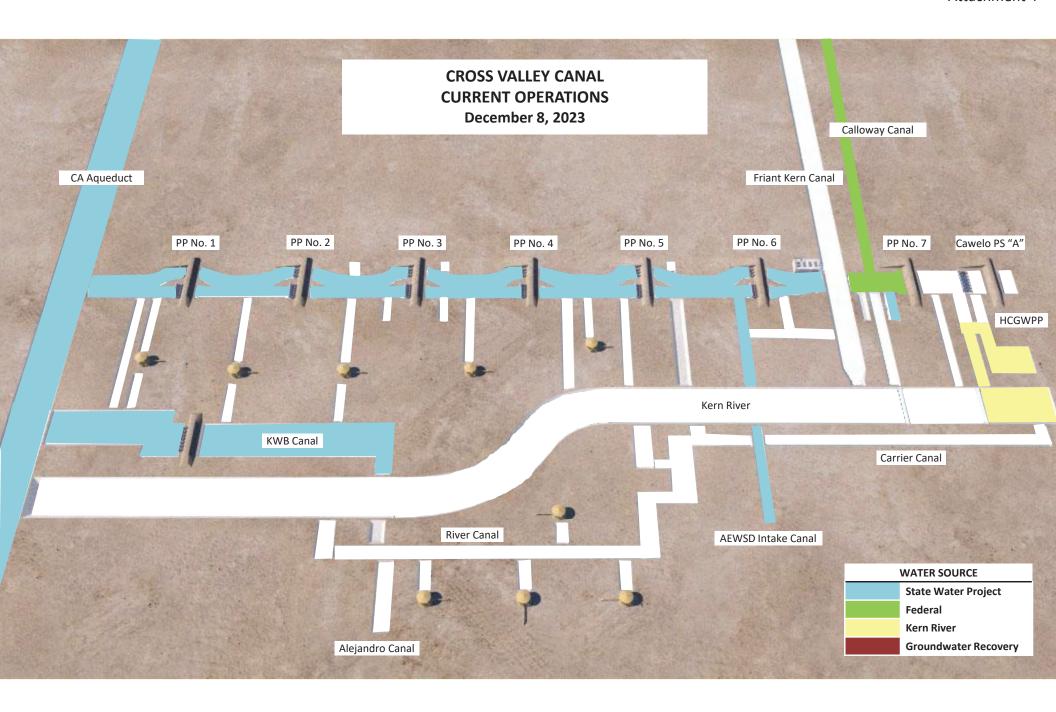


Cross Valley Canal Twelve Month Delivery by Direction
