#### II. CONSENT CALENDAR

M/S/C (Mendonca/Borba) (yes-7, no-0): By unanimous vote, with Directors Antongiovanni and Spitzer absent, the Board approved and authorized items II A through II C of the Consent Calendar.

#### III. BUSINESS AND FINANCE

- A. <u>Business & Finance Committee Report December 12, 2024:</u> District Controller Duncan provided a report from the December Business & Finance Committee Meeting.
- A(i). <u>Approval of November 2024 Financial Reports:</u> Mr. Duncan presented the November 2024 District and Water Banking Project(s) Financial Statements, Treasurer's Reports, and District Delinquency Report.

M/S/C (Garone/Kaiser) (yes-7, no-0): By unanimous vote, with Directors Antongiovanni and Spitzer absent, the Board approved the November 2024 District and Water Banking Project(s) Financial Statements, Treasurer's Reports, and Delinquency Report as presented.

#### IV. OPERATIONS AND PROJECTS

- A. A(i-iv). Operations and Projects Committee Report December 3, 2024 (Meeting Canceled): Assistant General Manager Bellue reported on several items, including District maintenance activities, recent encroachment permit requests, pending development projects impacting District facilities, and a status update related to the Sunset Groundwater Banking project.
- B. Ratification of Task Order #3 with Lonnie A. Cross Land Leveling Inc. For Miscellaneous Canal Dredging in an amount not to exceed \$34,320: Staff explained the District needed outside resources to address multiple maintenance activities during the limited shutdown window, including ongoing dredging of specific canals. The above referenced Task Order #3 provided additional resources to supplement District staff efforts during the winter shutdown period and was previously authorized by the General Manager. Staff requested the Board ratify that action.
- M/S/C (Kaiser/Fanucchi) (yes-7, no-0): By unanimous vote, with Directors Antongiovanni and Spitzer absent, the Board ratified Task Order #3 with Lonnie A. Cross Land Leveling Inc. for miscellaneous canal dredging in an amount not to exceed \$34,320, as presented.

#### V. WATER RESOURCES REPORT

- A. A(i-iii). <u>District Watermaster Report:</u> Staff reviewed and discussed the water supplies of the District for the months of November and early December. Approximately 5,305 acre-feet of water was diverted in District during November. Staff also provided information related to current precipitation totals and future forecasts. It was noted that the current SWP allocation stood at 5%.
- B. <u>Kern River Watermaster Report:</u> The December Kern River Watermaster Report was included in the Board packet.
- C. <u>District Groundwater Manager Report:</u> Groundwater Manager Marquez provided verbal comments supplementing graphical information regarding depth to groundwater at various monitoring locations throughout the District.

#### VI. MANAGER'S REPORT

- A. A(i). Verbal / District Grower Portal Update: Mr. Teglia and Office Manager Rodriguez provided a brief verbal report regarding recent enhancements to the District's website and the District grower portal. New features include the ability for District customers to pay for annual assessments via the District website or grower portal and for water users to pay for monthly water bills via the District grower portal. In addition, a current listing of delinquent property assessments will be maintained on the District website for review and easy reference for those looking to pay outstanding delinquencies. This listing will be updated monthly. Staff noted that use of the new features has already occurred and resulted in positive feedback.
- A(ii). <u>SGMA Update:</u> Mr. Teglia introduced Maureen Reilly with Todd Groundwater, who provided a presentation regarding the newly adopted Kern Subbasin/KRGSA 2024 Groundwater Sustainability Plan. It was noted that the adopted plan was recently submitted to the State Water Resources Control Board for review.
- B. External Agency Report: Mr. Teglia provided verbal comments supplementing a memorandum included in the Board package which provided information on the meetings and activities of various external agencies. These agencies include, but are not limited to, the Kern County Water Agency, Kern Fan Authority, Kern River Watershed Coalition Authority, Kern Water Collaborative, Kern Non-Districted Land Authority, Kern River Groundwater Sustainability Agency, the South Valley Water Resources Authority, the Water Association of Kern County, and the Integrated Regional Water Management Plan.
- C. <u>Water Banking Projects Report:</u> Mr. Teglia provided verbal comments supplementing a memorandum included in the Board package which provided information on water banking project activity on the Kern Fan as well as District water banking project activities. Mr. Teglia also provided a brief report regarding a recent field visit by MWD representatives.

#### VII. ATTORNEY'S REPORT

- A. Verbal: Mr. Iger provided a brief presentation regarding Director compensation regulations.

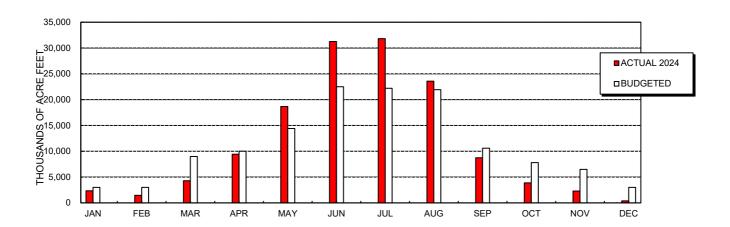

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

#### **DISCUSSION:**

The Investment Policy of Kern Delta Water District requires the District's Treasurer to submit to the Board of Directors a quarterly investment report. In compliance with this directive the District Controller offers the following discussion and analysis of the District's cash and cash equivalents position and performance through December 31, 2024.

A comparative overview of the District's cash and cash equivalents position as of December 31, 2024, is shown in the following table:

Total Cash and Cash Equivalents increased \$1.56 million during the fourth quarter of 2024. Operational revenue tends to diminish during the fourth quarter due to the seasonal nature of water use. Operational expenses during the fourth quarter usually exceed cash collections of fourth quarter operational revenues. The negative cash flow from operations was offset favorably and significantly by the \$2.95 million in property taxes apportioned by Kern County to the District in December 2024.

#### **LPL Financial Review:**

A combined total of \$5.25 million in US Treasuries and Fixed CDs matured during the fourth quarter and the District used those funds to purchase \$5 million in US Treasuries with annualized yields of 4.16%. The District received \$474,000 in Interest payments during the fourth quarter, most of which was paid at the time of maturity of the instruments noted earlier.

#### JP Morgan Funds Review:

The Funds held at JP Morgan are in money market accounts that are 100% invested in US Treasuries. As of December 31, 2024, the average yield on these funds was 4.17% compared to the prior quarter's yield of 4.62%. Interest earned for the third quarter of 2024 was \$71,483. Excess cash made available in the normal course of operations is directed to the JP Morgan account as soon as possible and earns interest at the rates noted until management is directed to invest it elsewhere by the Business and Finance Committee.

Kern County Treasury Funds: Yields on cash reserves held at the Kern County Treasury (KCT) have improved but are still outpaced by the yields provided by the District's investments held in money market and long-term instruments. As of September 30, 2024, the annualized yield on KCT funds increased slightly to 3.53% compared to 3.46% as of June 30, 2024. At the direction of the Board of Directors, staff continues to steer cash reserves away from KCT and into the higher yield money market and long-term holdings noted.

The attached "Kern Delta Water District Summary of Invested Cash Reserves" and "Kern County Treasurer's Pooled Cash Portfolio Summary" describe the nature and mix of the investments held at LPL Financial and at the KCT, respectively, as of December 31, 2024.

As of November 30, 2024, the Fair Market Value of KCT funds had decreased slightly to 99.89% of Cost compared to 100.07% on August 31, 2024. It should be noted that the FMV of U.S. Treasuries and Federal Agencies, representing 78.0% of the entire KCT portfolio, is 99.91% and is, thusly, a key factor in the overall valuation of the portfolio. As a reminder, the FMV adjustment is a valuation disclosure required by generally accepted accounting principles. If all invested cash was liquidated from the District's accounts at Kern County, the actual cost, plus accrued interest, would be recovered and not the fair market value.

It should be noted that (1) all investment actions executed since the last report have been made in full compliance with the investment policy of the District and, (2) the District will meet its expenditure obligations for the next six months.

#### **COMMON USE AGREEMENT**

Agreement No.

THIS COMMON USE AGREEMENT (the "Agreement"), entered into this \_\_\_day of \_\_\_\_\_, 2024 (the "Effective Date"), by and between KERN DELTA WATER DISTRICT, a California water district ("Water District") and BAKERSFIELD SENIOR CENTER, INC, a California nonprofit public benefit corporation ("BSC"). Water District and BSC are sometimes hereinafter individually or collectively called a "Party" or the "Parties".

#### **RECITALS**

**WHEREAS**, BSC owns certain real property in the City of Bakersfield, County of Kern, State of California, commonly referred to as Assessor Parcel Nos. 009-403-24, 009-401-06, and 009-402-07, more specifically shown in Exhibit A ("BSC Property");

**WHEREAS**, Water District is the owner and operator of an open ditch irrigation canal commonly known as the Kern Island (the "Canal") now existing adjacent to the BSC Property, as identified in Exhibit A. Water District also owns certain real property commonly referred to as Assessor Parcel No. 009-402-06 ("Water District Property") which includes the Canal and is adjacent to the BSC Property;

**WHEREAS**, BSC operates a senior center on the BSC Property which contains certain encroachments on Water District Property and Water District Property operates within the historic easement on BSC Property, as shown on Exhibit A and identified as the "Common Use Area;"

**WHEREAS**, the Canal was constructed in the late 1800's and enjoys a first in time priority over the construction of any improvement that might subsequently cross the Canal or the Canal Easement, as identified in Exhibit A;

**WHEREAS**, Water District and BSC desire to memorialize certain terms, restrictions, and conditions hereinafter set forth in this Agreement for the use and improvement by BSC of the Common Use Area for the improvement of the existing senior center.

**NOW, THEREFORE,** for valuable consideration, Water District and BSC, on behalf of themselves and their respective successors and assigns hereby mutually agree as follows:

#### <u>AGREEMENT</u>

#### 1. Access and Use Over and Across Common Use Area.

- a. BSC has prepared, at its expense, detailed plans and specifications made by HPI Architecture dated 11/17/2023, last revised 6/17/2024, designated as Bakersfield Senior Center and Housing (the "Senior Center Plans"), which include a detailed site plan, architectural plans and specifications of the planned improvements to the BSC Property and senior center, including those improvements that will be installed over and across the Common Use Area (the "Senior Center Project"). The Senior Center Plans have been approved in writing by the Water District and are incorporated herein and made a part of this Agreement.
- b. Water District hereby grants to BSC, its lenders, partners, affiliates, tenants and successors, assigns, employees, contractors, consultants, agents, invitees and licensees, access and use over and across the Common Use Area for the construction, installation, operation, and maintenance of the Senior Center Project, including the following:
- i. For the purpose of constructing, inspecting, operating, and maintaining any equipment and materials for construction of the Senior Center Project;
- ii. For the purpose of parking, and pedestrian and vehicular ingress, egress and access from and to the senior center and BSC Property, including ingress, egress, and access from and to the senior center by any portion of the access driveway over and across the Common Use Area:
- iii. If necessary, for the placement and maintenance of utilities to provide utility services for the operation and activities of the Senior Center Project; and,
- iv. For the placement and maintenance of any signage related to the Senior Center Project.
- c. BSC agrees to construct and install the improvements over and across the Common Use Area in material compliance with the Senior Center Plans. In no event, shall BSC construct and install facilities or improvements within the Common Use Area that are not in material compliance with the Senior Center Plans, without first obtaining the written approval of Water District.
- d. In all instances, said construction and installation work shall be done at a time that will not interfere with the flow or distribution of water through the Canal as required and approved by Water District in writing, unless this provision. is waived by the Water District in writing.

- e. BSC consents to the Water District's continued use of Canal in the Common Use Area subject to the terms and conditions herein contained.
- f. BSC acknowledges the Canal and the priority of Water District's title over BSC's rights in the Canal. Except as expressly set forth herein, this Agreement shall not in any way alter, modify, or terminate the legal rights of Water District in the Canal.
- g. The Parties agree to reasonably coordinate and schedule any construction in the Common Use Area such that it does not interfere with the flow or distribution of water through the Canal as required and approved by Water District, and it does not interfere with construction, access, activities, operation, and maintenance of the Senior Center Project except in cases of emergency threatening personal injury, loss of life, or significant property damage.
- h. Both Water District and BSC shall use and maintain said Common Use Area in such a manner as not to interfere unreasonably with the rights of the other.

#### 2. <u>Maintenance of the Common Use Area.</u>

- a. BSC will maintain any Senior Center Project improvements within the Common Use Area in good condition and repair and shall pay all costs of such repairs and maintenance and of any replacement of any part thereof required to provide safe access over and across the Common Use Area, except for costs resulting from the negligence or misconduct of Water District.
- b. Except in emergencies, BSC shall give reasonable notice to Water District before performing any work in the Common Use Area related to the Senior Center Project or senior center. In the event that the future use of said senior center driveway shall at any time or times necessitate a rearrangement, relocation, reconstruction or removal over and across the Common Use Area, BSC shall notify Water District in writing of such necessity. BSC will provide Water District with plans of a proposed rearrangement or modification and upon approval of such plans by Water District, BSC will promptly proceed to effect such rearrangement, relocation, reconstruction, or removal.
- c. Any work performed by either Party on the Common Use Area shall comply with any applicable ordinances or laws.
- d. In no event, other than as reasonably required from time to time for temporary construction and maintenance and following reasonable advance written notice to the other Party, shall any Party block access and use over and across the Common Use Area or restrict or interfere with in any manner the access and free flow pedestrian and vehicular traffic over any portion of the Common Use Area.
- e. BSC shall access, use, and maintain any and all improvements over and across the Common Use Area in such a manner as not to interfere unreasonably with the rights of Water District in the Canal.

f. Water District will maintain the Canal and related infrastructure in good condition and repair and shall pay all costs of such repairs and maintenance.

#### 3. <u>Indemnity</u>.

a. BSC hereby agrees and undertakes to indemnify, defend and hold harmless Water District, its Board members, officers, agents, and employees from any and all losses, costs, expenses (including reasonable attorneys' fees), claims, liabilities, actions or damages of any nature whatsoever, including injuries to or the death of any person or persons or damage to any property, in any way arising out of or connected with or incident to or alleged to have arisen in any manner out of, or to have been in any way connected with or incident to any negligent or reckless act or omission or willful misconduct of BSC, its Board members, officers, agents, employees, contractors, subcontractors, or independent contractors in the performance of this Agreement or to have occurred as a result of any, negligent or reckless acts or omissions or willful misconduct by BSC, its Board members, officers, agents, and employees in the performance of this Agreement.

#### 4. **General Provisions.**

- a. By entering into this Agreement, Water District does not extinguish, abandon, forfeit, relinquish, waive, modify, limit, restrict, or alter in any way Water District's water rights, including but not limited to, any and all water rights associated with or conveyed across the Common Use Area, and this Agreement further does not and will not restrict, interrupt, limit, or diminish Water District's use of and access to any of this water rights and water supplies.
- b. Each Party shall procure and maintain in full force and effect throughout the term of this Agreement, general public liability insurance and property damage insurance against claims for personal injury, death, or property damage occurring in or about its property, with limits of not less than Two Million and No/100 Dollars (\$2,000,000.00) for injury or death of a single person, and to the limit of not less than Two Million and No/100 Dollars (\$2,000,000.00) for property damage.
- c. Any contractor working in the Common Use Area shall procure and maintain general liability insurance, providing coverage on an occurrence basis for bodily injury, including death, of one or more persons, property damage and personal injury, with limits of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) per occurrence. The liability policy shall contain an additional insured endorsement which shall expressly name both BSC and Water District, their Board members, officers, agents, employees, and consultants as additional insureds, without limitation. In addition, the contractor and/or subcontractors shall maintain workers' compensation insurance while working within the Common Use Area. The workers' compensation policy shall contain an express waivers of subrogation endorsement in favor of BSC and the Water District, their Board members, officers, agents, employees and consultants. Said additional insured endorsement and workers' compensation subrogation endorsement shall be furnished in the form approved by the Water District's legal counsel prior to any work authorized pursuant to this Agreement.

- d. Water District and BSC shall not become or be deemed partners or joint venturers or associates by reason of the provisions of this Agreement. No Party shall for any purpose be considered an agent, officer, or employee of the other Party.
- e. The failure of any Party to enforce against another Party any provision of this Agreement shall not constitute a waiver of that Party's right to enforce such a provision at a later time and shall not serve to vary the terms of this Agreement.
- f. This Agreement may not be terminated, and no provision of this Agreement may be amended or added to except by an agreement in writing which is signed by the Parties hereto or their assigns or respective successors in interest and indicates that it is an amendment of this Agreement and approved in writing.
- g. If any term, provision, condition, restriction, or covenant of this Agreement or its application to any Party or circumstance shall be held, to any extent, invalid or unenforceable, then the remainder of this Agreement, or the application of such term, provision, condition, restriction or covenant to any Party or circumstances other than those as to whom or which it is held invalid or unenforceable, shall not be effected and shall be valid and enforceable to the fullest extent permitted by law.
  - h. Time is of the essence with respect to each and every provision of this Agreement.
- i. In the event of a conflict between the terms, conditions or specifications set forth in this Agreement and those in Exhibits attached hereto, the terms, conditions, restrictions, and specifications set forth in this Agreement shall prevail. All Exhibits to which reference is made in this Agreement are deemed incorporated in this Agreement whether or not actually attached.
- j. All notices and other communications required under this Agreement or permitted will be in writing and will be given by United States mail, certified mail, return receipt requested; reputable delivery service with a delivery receipt; electronic mail with delivery confirmation; or personal delivery with a delivery receipt, addressed as follows:

Notice will be deemed to have been received on the date shown on the delivery receipt or confirmation as the date of delivery, the date delivery was refused, or the date the item was returned as undeliverable.

- k. The laws of the State of California will govern the validity of this Agreement, its interpretation and performance. Any litigation arising in any way from this Agreement shall be brought in Kern County, California.
- l. Neither this Agreement, nor any interest in it, may be assigned or transferred by any Party without the prior written consent of all the Parties, except as provided in this paragraph. Any assignment requiring the prior written consent of all Parties may be subject to additional terms and conditions not set forth herein. The consent of Water District for assignment of this Agreement by BSC will not be required for: (i) assignment to an affiliate of BSC, a limited partnership of which BSC or an affiliate of BSC is a general partner ("BSC's limited partnership"), or to a limited liability company in which BSC or an affiliate of BSC is a member, District or (ii) assignment to the Housing Authority of the Kern County or its affiliate, provided that the assignee, as applicable, assumes all obligations under this Agreement and provides a copy of the assumption agreement to Water District.
- m. The rights and obligations of this Agreement shall inure to the benefit of, and be binding upon, the Parties to this Agreement and their heirs, administrators, executors, personal representatives, successors and assigns.
- n. Each Party shall execute and deliver such papers, documents, and instruments, and perform such acts as are necessary or appropriate, to implement the terms of this Agreement and the intent of the Parties to this Agreement.
- o. This Agreement is made for the benefit of the Parties hereto and is not intended to confer any benefit upon any third party. Except for any indemnified person's rights under any express indemnification contained in this Agreement, no parties other than BSC, Water District and their successors and assigns shall have any rights or remedies against any Party by reason of this Agreement. Specifically, without limitation, no design professionals, contractors, or other persons supplying materials or services to the Common Use Area shall have any right against any Party by reason of this Agreement.

- p. It is expressly agreed that no breach of this Agreement shall entitle any party to cancel, rescind, or otherwise terminate this Agreement including the grants to access and use the Common Use Area or defeat or render invalid the lien of any mortgage or deed of trust made in good faith and for value as to any part of the Common Use Area or any improvements located thereon.
- q. The covenants herein shall be construed to be covenants running with the land with respect to the interests of the Parties hereto and their assigns or successors in interest until this agreement terminates, and any grant, transfer or conveyance of interest in land or leases subject hereto shall be and hereby is conditioned upon the assumption of all privileges and obligations hereunder to the grantee, transferee or other successor in interest, except as otherwise provided in this Agreement.
- r. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary set forth herein, in the event of a foreclosure of any deed of trust lien encumbering the Common Use Area (a "Lien") or a deed or other transfer in lieu of foreclosure of any Lien, neither the holder of the Lien (a "Lienholder") nor any other Purchaser (as defined hereafter) shall be (i) liable for any act or omission of the foreclosed upon owner of the Common Use Area (the "Prior Owner"), (ii) obligated to construct, develop or pay for any improvements to or on the Common Use Area, (iii) liable for any breach of any representation or warranty made by the Prior Owner, or (iv) liable for any indemnity obligations of the Prior Owner contained in the Agreement, except with respect to Purchaser's acts or omissions. As used herein, "Purchaser" means any transferee, including Lienholder, of Prior Owner's interest in the Common Use Area pursuant to a foreclosure of a Lien or a deed or other transfer in lieu of foreclosure of a Lien, and the successors and assigns of such transferee who is not an affiliate of the Prior Owner.
- s. This Agreement has been negotiated and prepared by both BSC and Water District. Any rule of contract interpretation to the effect that ambiguities or uncertainties are to be interpreted against the drafting party, or the party that caused it to exist, shall not be employed in the interpretation of this Agreement or any document executed in connection with this Agreement. The use of the words "include" and/or "including" shall not imply exclusivity and shall be interpreted to mean "include(ing), without limitation" and/or "include(ing), but not limited to." The headings of this Agreement are for purposes of reference only and shall not limit or define the meaning of the provisions of this Agreement.
- t. This Agreement constitutes the entire understanding and agreement of BSC and Water District regarding subject matters set forth in this Agreement and supersedes any and all prior or contemporaneous agreements or understandings, oral or written, between the Parties regarding such matters.
- u. Each Party agrees that it shall be reasonable and cooperate with the other Party on any matters that impact either Common Use Area, including, but not limited to the execution and recording of any amendments to this Agreement which may be reasonably required by either Party to further the intent and purpose of this Agreement.

- v. Each individual signing this Agreement on behalf of the respective entities represents and warrants that he or she is, respectively, duly authorized to sign on behalf of the entities and to bind the entities fully to each and all of the obligations set forth in this Agreement.
- w. Upon execution hereof, this Agreement shall be recorded in the Official Records of Kern County.
- x. This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be an original, but all of which shall, together, constitute one and the same instrument.

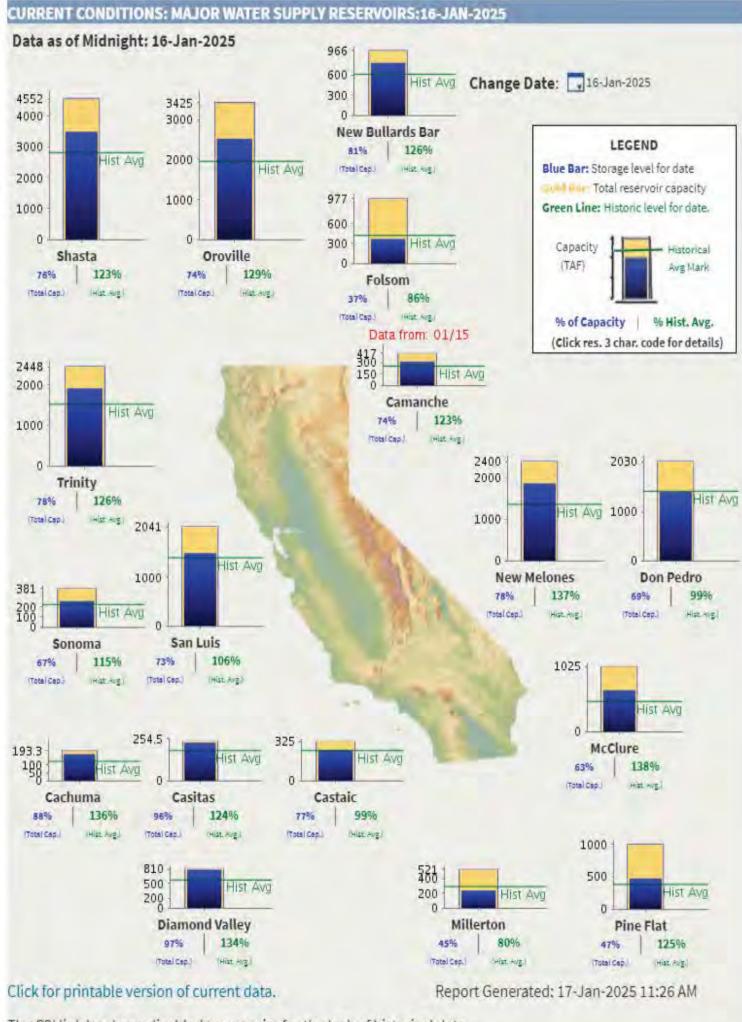


### Isabella Lake Conditions

With the late November atmospheric river that arrived in northern California and improved water supply conditions as reflected in the December 1, 2024 forecast, the Department of Water Resources (DWR) is increasing the State Water Project (SWP) allocation from five to fifteen percent of most State Water Project (SWP) contractors' requested Maximum Annual Table A Amounts for 2025, as shown in Attachment A – 2025 SWP Allocation, updated December 23, 2024. DWR may revise the SWP allocation if water supply conditions change.

To determine the available SWP water supplies, DWR considers factors including SWP contractors' anticipated carryover supplies into 2025, projected 2025 demands, existing storage in SWP conservation facilities, estimates of future runoff, SWP operational and regulatory requirements from the Federal Endangered Species Act and California Endangered Species Act, and water rights obligations under the State Water Resources Control Board's authority.

To schedule SWP water deliveries under this allocation, DWR will develop the fifteen percent water delivery schedules by prorating the ten percent schedules submitted by the SWP contractors in October 2024 (as part of initial requests) or as revised with any subsequent updates. If an SWP contractor foresees any changes to their water delivery schedule, please communicate such changes to DWR in a timely manner.

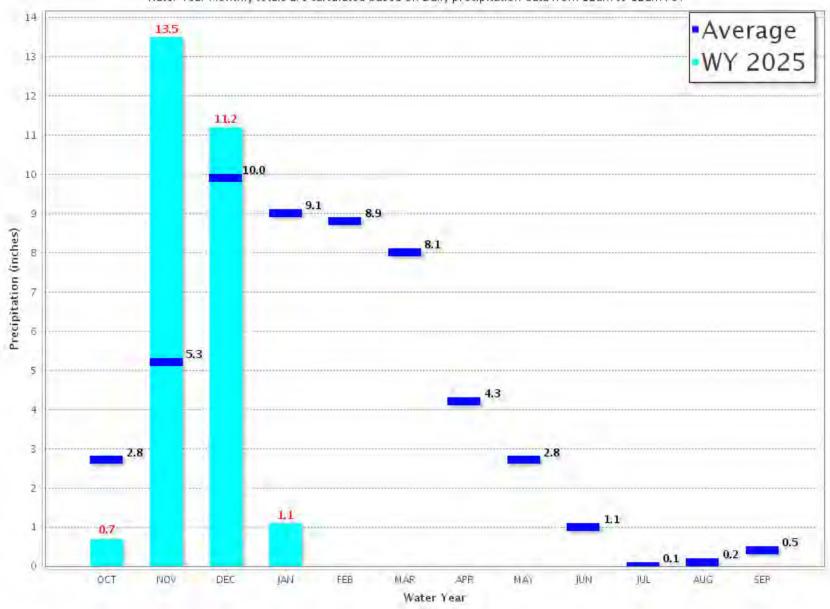


## Northern Sierra 8-Station

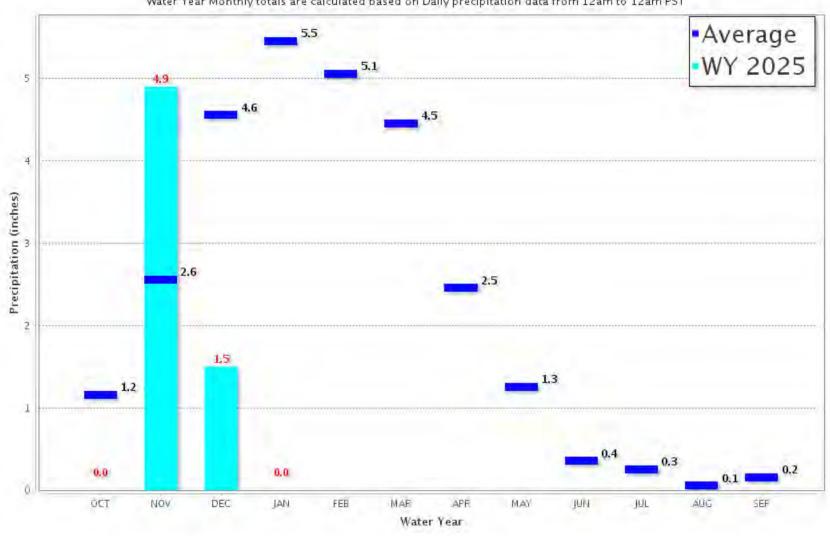

# California Snow Water Content, January 17, 2025, Percent of April 1 Average

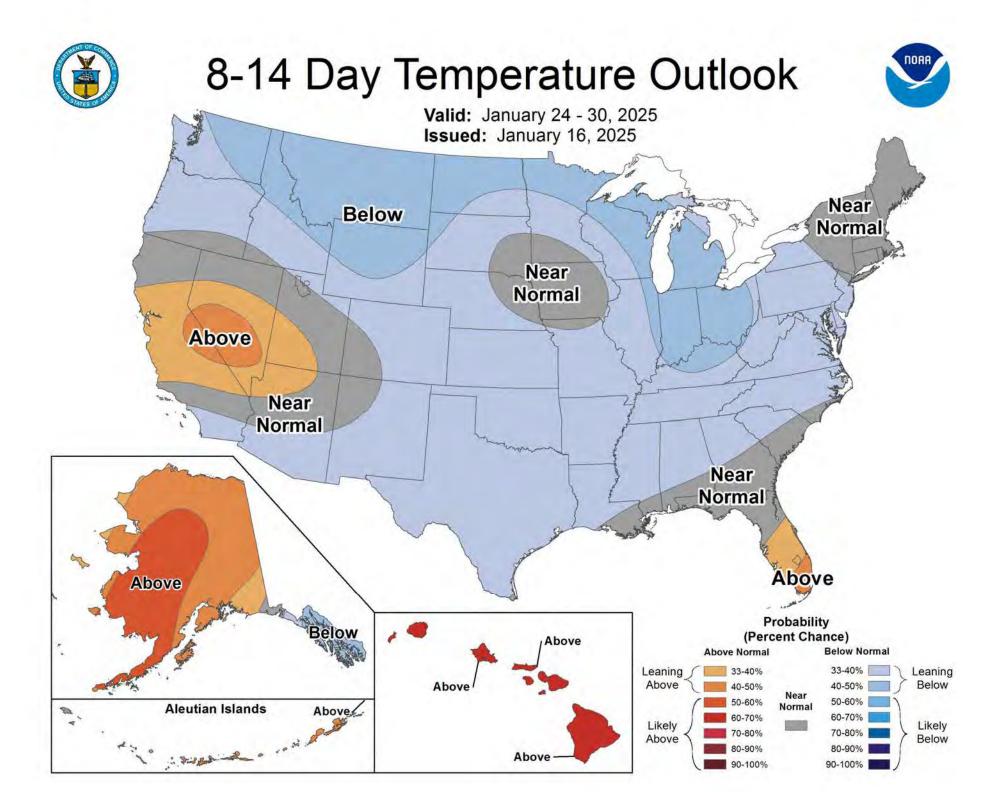


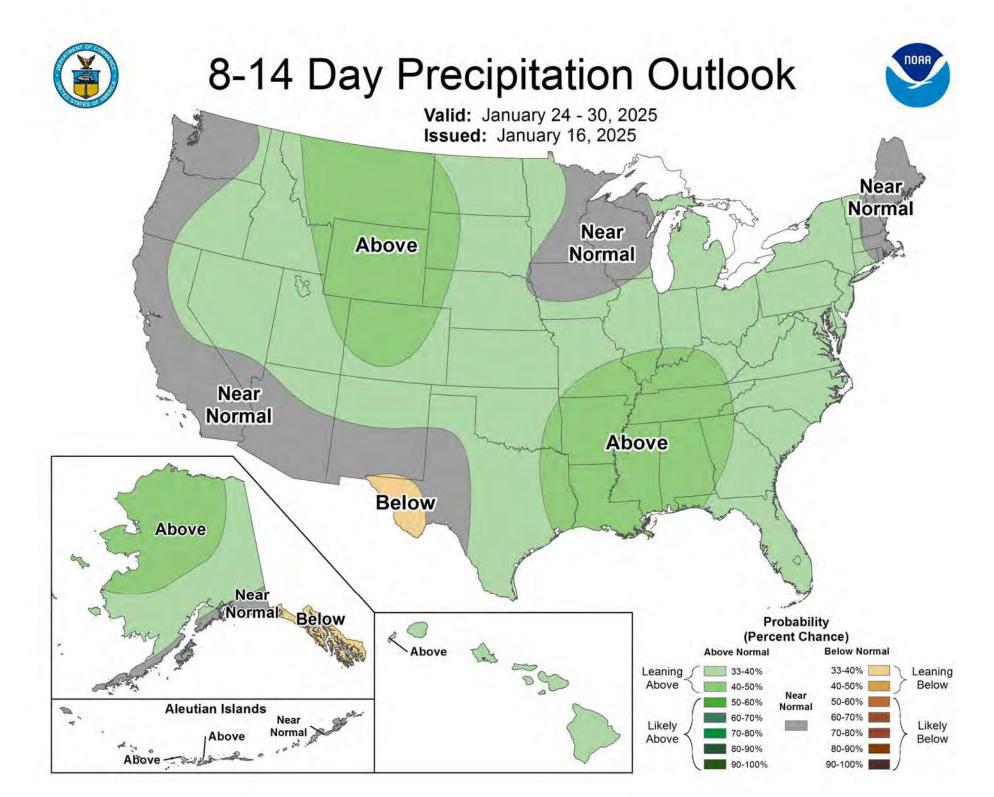

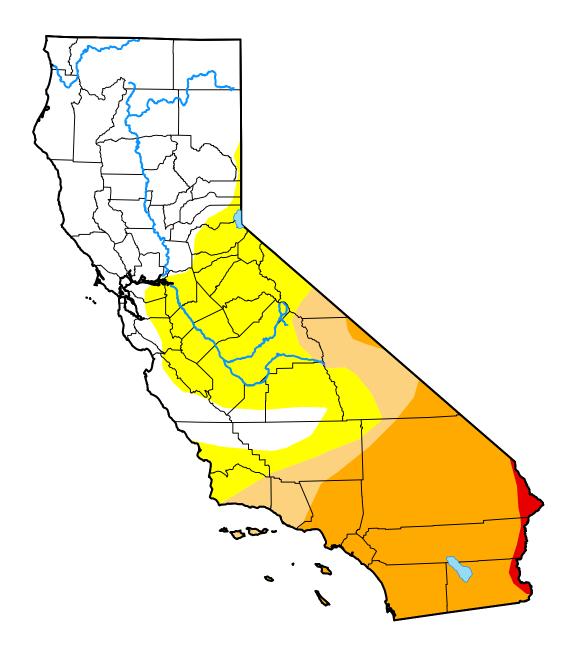

**April - July Forecast -** The California Nevada River Forecast Center (CNRFC) January 5th A-J runoff forecast is 63% of mean or approximately 292 TAF. This forecast assumes normal conditions going forward.

**Tulare Basin 6-Station Index -** California Data Exchange Center (CDEC) 6-Station precipitation index for January 5th shows the precipitation amount to be 70% of average for this day. It's interesting to note that this same index for January 8, 2024 was only 38% of average. This difference is shown graphically in the following chart entitled "Southern Region Snowpack as of 1/3/2025".

**8-14 Day Forecast -** The 8-14 Day temperature and precipitation probability outlook (January 13-19) is near normal for temperature and leaning below normal chance for precipitation.

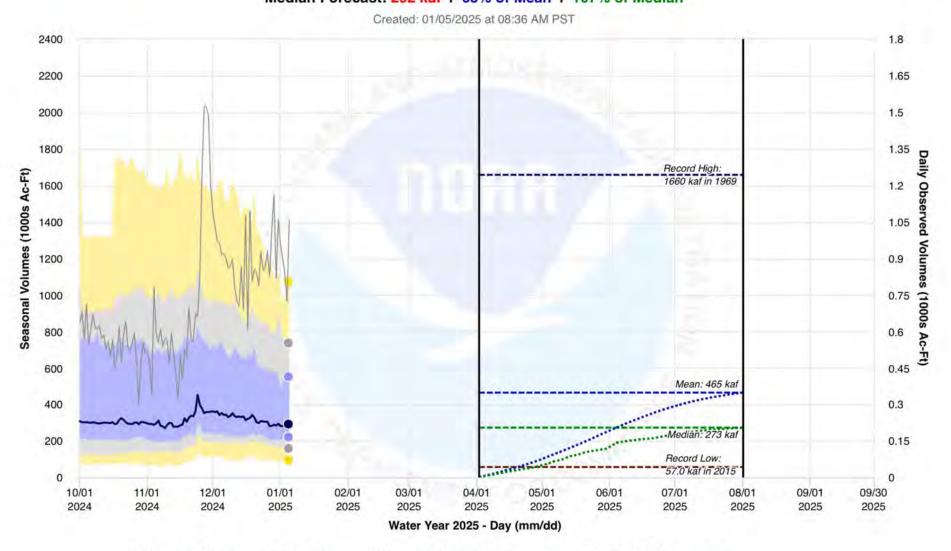

# 2024 Estimated Kern Fan Banking Project Deliveries (by Water Type) Deliveries through November 30, 2024 Total Deliveries 61,511 af

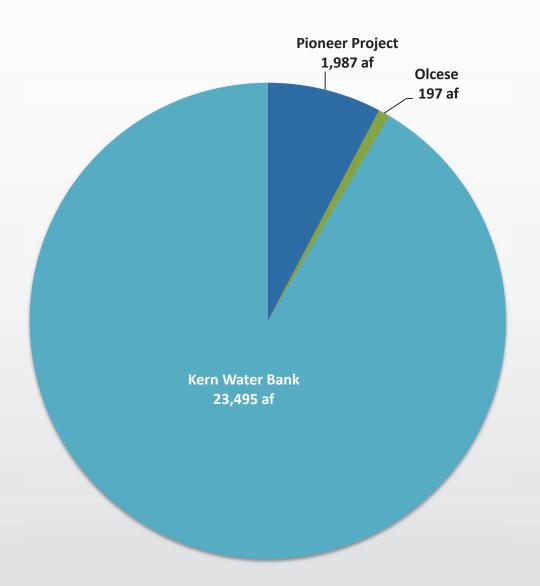

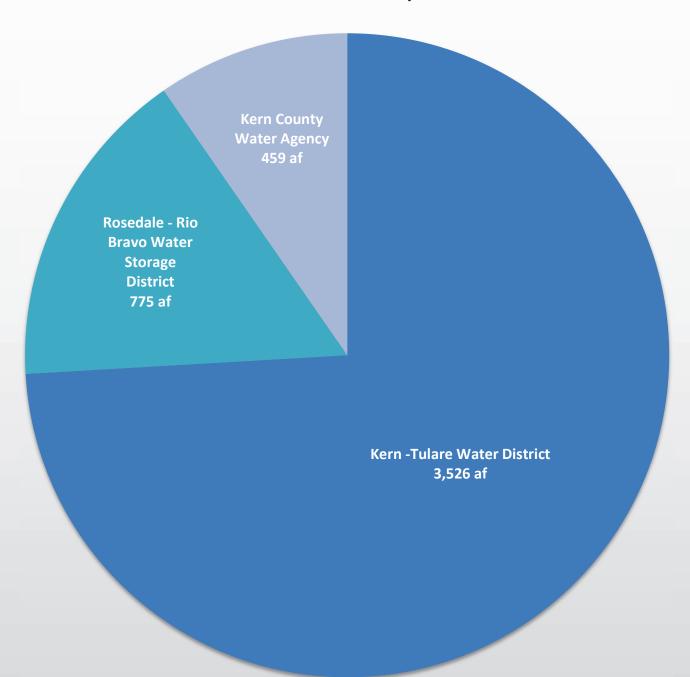

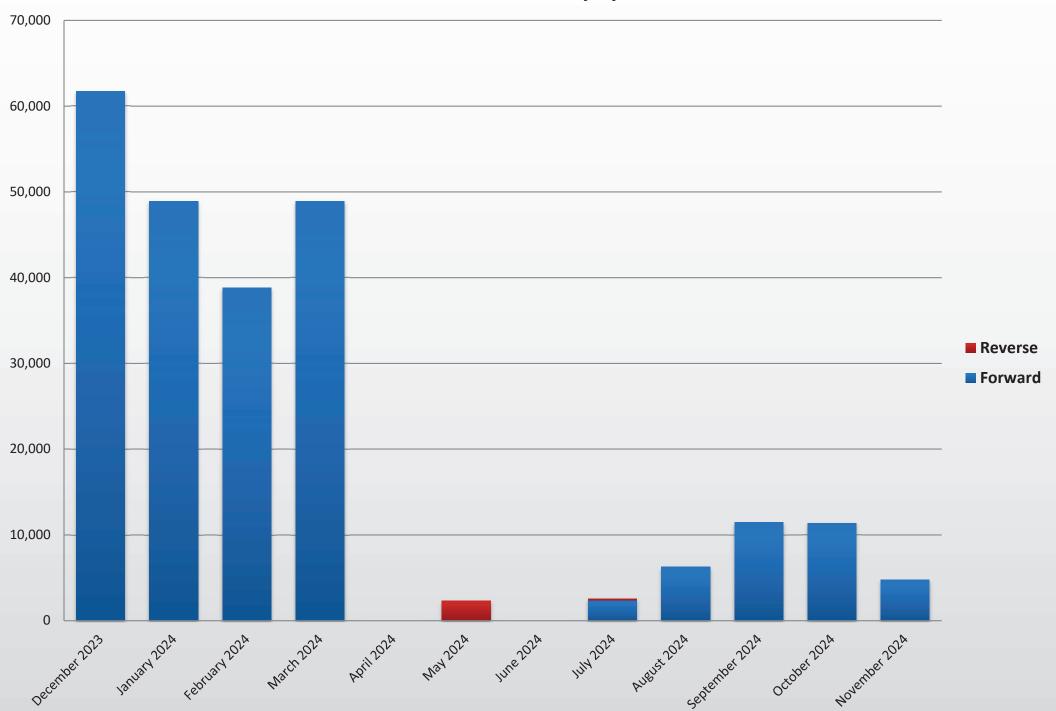
# Kern Fan Banking Projects 2024 Estimated Gross Recovery by Project Through November 30, 2024



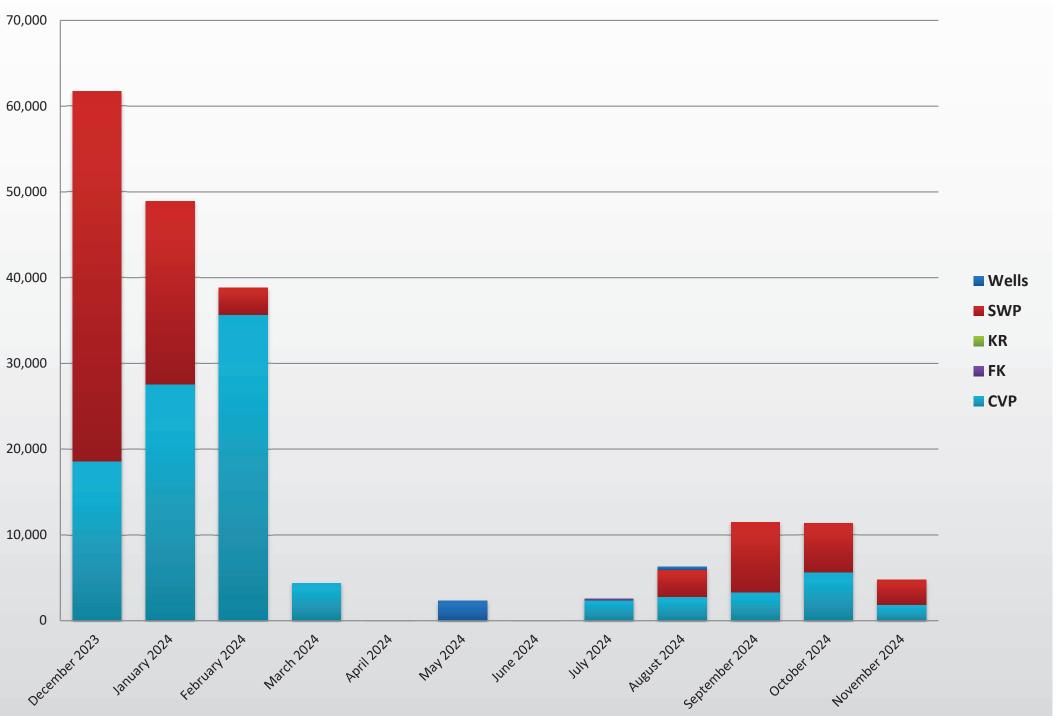

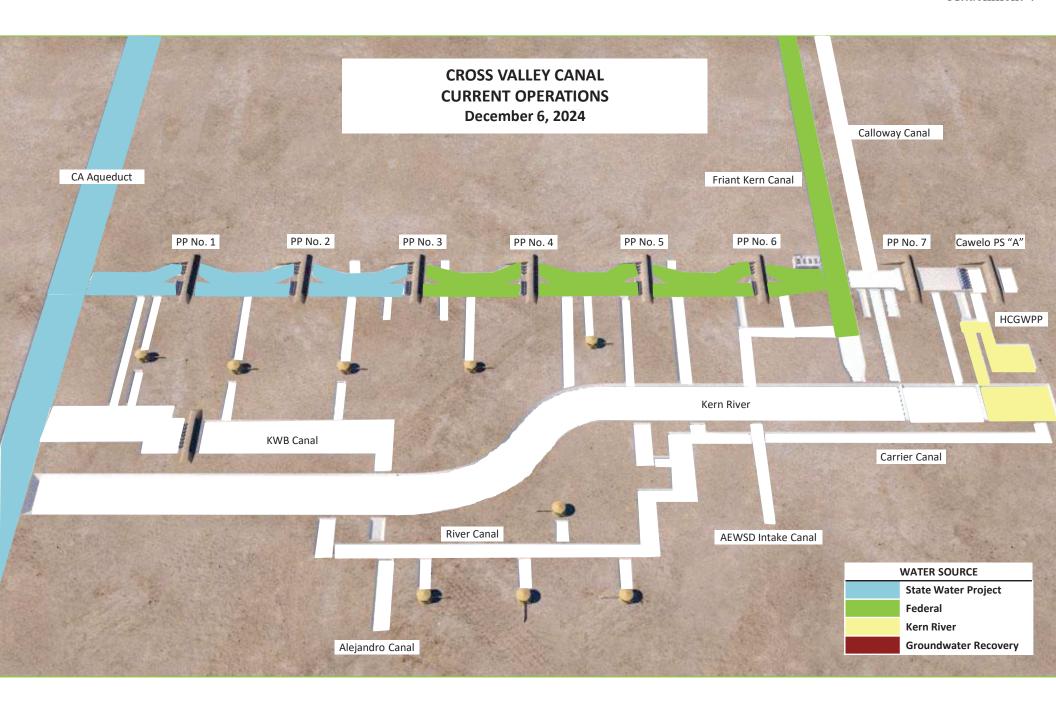


# Cross Valley Canal Twelve Month Delivery by Direction
